**Richland Hills Baptist Church** Joymakers and Youth Departments will present the musical production of "Three Wee Kings," on December 15 at 6:30 p.m.



## Hurt In Explosion

A former resident of Muleshoe, and 1970 graduate of Muleshoe High School, was seriously burned in an explosion at Bloomfield (N.M.) Refining Co. Monday night.

Thirty-three year old Cecil Cunningham, who formerly worked as a patrolman for the Muleshoe City Police Department before moving to New Mexico, is a patient at San Juan Regional Medical Center at Farmington, N.M. receiving treatment for second degree burns to his hands and face.

**Bloomfield Fire Chief George** Duncan said one explosion occurred about 8:25 p.m. (MST) Monday in an office of Bloomfield Refining Co. He said a second explosion ripped through the same offices at the refinery about 10 minutes later.

Cunningham, an employee of the Bloomfield Refining Co., is also a firefighter for the nearby community of Aztec.

The fire chief said there was no immediate estimate for the cost of the damages, but said the officer area was heavily damaged by smoke and fire. He also said Cunningham was 'blown out a door," in the second explosion, and received his burns and injuries at that time. Also injured in the second explosion were four other persons, although none of the other four injured required hospitalization. The injured man is the son of Hazel Cunningham, who operated 'Hazel's Stylette' in Muleshoe for a number of years before retiring and moving to Bloomfield nearly three years ago. He is a nephew of Mr. and Mrs. W.W. Wilson of Muleshoe. Cunningham is married to the former Kathy Coker of Lazbuddie, and they are the parents of two daughters, Misty and Farrah.

Occupants of the helicopter turned out to be DPS Motor Vehicle Theft Division Investigator Jerry Johnson and a DPS pilot. Johnson told The Journal that he was in Muleshoe to investigate "the possible theft of some trailers."

In fact, around 4 p.m. on Thursday, Johnson said officers had verified that two trailers found 11 miles west of Muleshoe on FM1760 at the location of the illegal lab had proven to be have been reported stolen.

A trailer, of the type used to haul cars, had been reported stolen from Dallas, and the second trailer, a large, enclosed 'reefer' trailer, had been reported stolen from Carrolton.

Johnson also said a third trailer, this one housing the illegal lab, was being checked out. He said it was also possibly stolen from somewhere in the Dallas area.

The Bailey County man who is currently jailed under \$60,000 bond on three separate drug charges, was arrested at a location in the West Camp area.

Clovis City Police officers had received information that the man had made a purchase of large amounts of a chemical used in the manufacture of methamphetamines and amphetamines.

The Clovis officers notified Texas officers, who tracked the man from Dallas to Clovis and to the Bailey County location where the illegal lab was confiscated following a raid by Bailey County officers, DPS investigators and federal Drug Enforcement Administration officers.



## Weather

What is the significance of the closeness of the lines on weather maps?

When the lines on the weather map in your newspaper are close together (these lines are isobars) that means pressure changes are great.

Isobars are merely lines connecting points on the map which have reported the same barometric pressure.

If the pressure differential is great, even over a short distance, winds, and probably stiff ones, are sure to be encountered. That means for all practical purposes, that the top of the great layer of gases surrounding the earth is extremely hilly, so that air rushes from high peaks into the valleys nearby at great speed.

This speed, or wind velocity, causes heavy wind. If the incline is not steep--the lines (or isobars) not close together--then the wind will flow more slowly, down a more gradual incline at the top of the layer of gas above you.


