



word. It can be used to describe the process of going from blindness to regaining sight and it can describe a religious movement.

It can also be a descriptor for taking humanity (and all of creation) back to its Genesis 1 and 2 state of peace with the Creator.

In direct violation of one of the irrefutable laws of leadersnip, Jesus instructs the blind men not to let anyone know about this encounter. Didn't he understand the momentum this healing might have created? What is the point of keeping this

secret? Wasn't he starting a new movement? Why not use this event as a fund-raiser?

It is not every day one steps from darkness to light. The stern warning from Jesus is thoroughly ignored by the newly restored men.





Our President and our Congress have been very busy in the past few months working on a universal health program for the citizens of the United States. There seems to be a reaction to this bill which is parallel to the reactions of the big business bailouts and the new stipulations on credit cards.

We know that with the bank bailouts which were supposed to-make more money available for the purchase of homes and the prevention of foreclosures on existing homes, that it is more difficult than ever to get a loan. One almost has to be in a position to guarantee his own loan in order to get one, such as having accessible financial collateral in all cases. As the banks hold on to their funds, foreclosures take place every day, and some of these foreclosures were not the result of subprime loans. Some banks are charging \$35.00 for each overdraft on your account, even if the overdraft is fifteen cents. That means you have to be careful and keep check on your accounts; your receipts and your payments.

The businesses which received bailout monies are still cutting back on production and employees while some of them continue to put more money in profits for the upper echelon personnel rather than hire more people to work in production of goods. They put more value on how they can make money rather than how to make a service available to the American people.

With the passing of the bill to curtail some of the credit card companies unscrupulous activities, it appears that their actions are even more foreboding. Certainly, everyone who has a credit card has received a notice in the mail about the changes in your


credit card contracts. One thing which we need to pay close attention to is the amount of interest being charged if your payment is late. Most companies are raising your minimum payment by 5% or no less than \$5.00 per month. In addition, some are charging \$1.00 for every statement that you receive. Currently, some cards are adding - my eye is the fact that you may 21.74% to the value of an index, divided by 365. The index will be the highest "Prime Rate" of interest found in the "Money Rates" of the Wall Street Journal
