Blacks And Whites Take Opposite Views On Reagan, lisues
Washington, DC - A poll released recently by the Joint Center for Political Studlies revealed that Blacks the problems facing the nation but differ sharply on the solutions to those problems. For example, $65 \%$ of Blacks felt the government should guarantee jobs for everyone willing to work. Only $24 \%$ of whires supported that idea. That's even though Blacks and whites felt unemployment was one of the top three problems facing the nation. President Reagan's popularity among whites remains high -standing $66 \%$,
But among Blacks, less than $25 \%$ of those surveyed approved of Reagan', overall job pertormance. On approved of Reagan " overall job pertormance. On of ihe president's job performance.

New York, N. Y... Forbes Magazine has released its annual listing of the 400 richest pecole in America.
This year's list includes two Blacks: Chicago publisher This year's list includes two Blacks: Chicago pubishier
John H. Johnson and Motown Records' president Berry Gordy. The magazine estimated Johnson's wealth at $\$ 185$ million and Gcrdy's at $\$ 180$ million. However, both Johnson and Gordy had fortunes which appeared small when compared to the richest man in America. That man is discount magnate Sam Moore Walton with an estimated fortune of $\$ 4.5$ billion.

New York, N.Y. - According to Advertising Age magazine the cost of a 30 -second commercial on the number-one-rated "Bill Cosby Show" has climbed to
