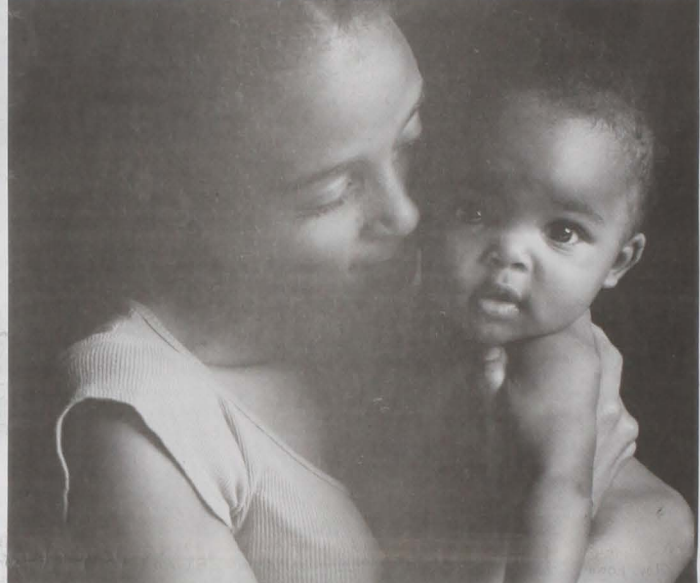

From the Desk of Parson D.A. Smith
"Smoking The Racist Brand"

The Black Press A Many Splended Things

The Black Press has withstood social and economic trials since 1884-not by being a jack of every thing, but a master at serving its community. We reflect what our community is and does. The key to the **Southwest Digest's** survival is no different than any other newspaper - Black owned or not. That is to print news and information that empowers its readers in a day when newspapers are filing bankruptcy, laying off in mass and flocking to the internet, the Black-owned newspapers are in a better position than most.

While the American Society of News Editors reports that newsrooms laid off nearly 6,000 journalists in 2008, the **Digest** seems to be an exception in the changing industry. Things are tough for us, but we don't have the same issues as other

newspapers those whom we serve continue to support our newspaper. A Peter Baily, a lecturer on the Black Press, says he considers the purpose of the Black Press documents the Black experience

If it were up to journalist of over 30 years, Black newspapers would begin to aggressively market themselves to talented young journalist instead of assuming that they would automatically run to papers like the **New York Times**.

Today, the student-run Hilltop newspaper at Howard University is the only daily Black newspaper in the country after the daily Chicago Defender Daily believes they should not be out there alone.

While some young Black journalist may prefer working at one of the nation's top five papers,

Eponi Farmer does not. "I'd rather work for the Black Press, because they need young reporters like myself to help change things," said Farmer, a senior journalism student at Howard University and an editor at The Hilltop. "I think that Black papers are still very important to the community and more than anything I want to have an impact on my community."

continue to put more money in profits for the upper echelon personnel rather than hire more people to work in production of goods. They put more value on how they can make money rather than how to make a service available to the American people.

With the passing of the bill to curtail some of the credit card companies unscrupulous activities, it appears that their actions are even more foreboding. Certainly, everyone who has a credit card has received a notice in the mail about the changes in your

credit card contracts. One thing which we need to pay close attention to is the amount of interest being charged if your payment is late. Most companies are raising your minimum payment by 5% or no less than \$5.00 per month. In addition, some are charging \$1.00 for every statement that you receive. Currently, some cards are adding 21.74% to the value of an index, divided by 365. The index will be the highest "Prime Rate" of interest found in the "Money Rates" of the Wall Street Journal for the preceding month. The

annual percentage rates of 24.99% will not increase or decrease until July 1, 2010. After that date, the 24.99% can increase if the Prime Rate increases.

Another thing which caught my eye is the fact that you may have a credit rating of 750 plus and the card company may not approve credit on your account at their discretion. You may pay on time all the time. It makes no difference. So, the best thing to

do now is to pay the full amount at the end of the month, if your transactions are approved.

With health care, there is one word: HIGH. The costs are spiraling every day, even vitamins and supplements and over the counter medications are out of control. Health care facilities and medical services and supplies all have out of sight prices. Sometimes you wonder if it is cheaper to die, but we know the

Our President and our Congress have been very busy in the past few months working on a universal health program for the citizens of the United States. There seems to be a reaction to this bill which is parallel to the reactions of the big business bailouts and the new stipulations on credit cards.

We know that with the bank bailouts which were supposed to make more money available for the purchase of homes and the prevention of foreclosures on existing homes, that it is more difficult than ever to get a loan. One almost has to be in a position to guarantee his own loan in order to get one, such as having accessible financial collateral in all cases. As the banks hold on to their funds, foreclosures take place every day, and some of these foreclosures were not the result of subprime loans. Some banks are charging \$35.00 for each overdraft on your account, even if the overdraft is fifteen cents. That means you have to be careful and keep check on your accounts; your receipts and your payments.

The businesses which received bailout monies are still cutting back on production and employees while some of them


