

Juneteenth Statue / Former Rep. Al Edwards Statue



The Juneteenth Statue / Rep. Al Edwards Statue is located at 1859 Ashton Villa Mansion, 24th and Broadway, Galveston Island, Texas, USA.

This 9 foot tall bronze statue was erected in 2005 on the grounds of Ashton Villa to commemorate the 1979 passage of legislation making June 19th a holiday "memorializing" the reading of the Emancipation Proclamation at Ashton Villa on June 19, 1865.

State Rep. Al Edwards (D-Houston) introduced the legislation in 1979 making June 19th a state holiday. The statue, costing approximately \$100,000.00, was created in his likeness and honors him. It was paid for with state tax dollars.

The statue is of Edwards holding up a copy of the law making June 19th a holiday. Because Edwards was still in office when the statue was unveiled, it is officially known as a "unknown lawmaker". Al Edwards stirred controversy in his heavily Democratic Houston district by voting with the House Republican leadership on a number of issues during the 78th and 79th sessions of the legislature, in addition to introducing controversial legislation (like having a statue of himself made, using tax dollars, while he was still in office...or a bill that would have made it against the law for high school cheerleaders to "shake their booty").

Here is a portion of the largest crowd who were in attendance at the last meeting of the Redistricting Committee at the Alderson Middle School on Monday evening, May 16, 2011. There were 110 citizens of District Two in attendance. All fifteen committee members were also present.

The Redistricting Committee, a 15 member group of Lubbock citizens appointed by the Lubbock City Council, will be meeting on Tuesday evening, June 7, 2011, at 6:00 p. m. to discuss their findings to be presented to the Lubbock City Council. After this, according to sources, a report will be sent to the Division of Civil Rights, U. S. Department of Justice for sixty days of intense work.

He was challenged in the 2006 Democratic primary election by two other Democrats, and defeated in a following run-off election. Edwards had served in the house for 27 years. (Update: He ran again in 2008 against the incumbent and won, after it was revealed that the incumbent had threatened people with a gun)

Eventually a much larger replica of this statue of Rep. Edwards is to be placed on the grounds of the Texas State Capitol in Austin -- also paid for with state tax dollars.



To help me understand my disdain for those who would destroy the American dream, I read an article by Paul Krug an Op-Ed Columnist of the New York Times titled: "Making Things in America" that I would share with you:—"I used to joke that Americans made a living by selling each other houses, which they paid for with money borrowed from China. Manufacturing, once America's greatest strength, seemed to be in terminal decline.

bright spots of a generally disappointing recovery, and there are signs-that a sustained comeback may be under way.

And there's something else you should know: If right-wing critics of efforts to rescue the economy had gotten their way, this comeback wouldn't be happening.

Crucially, the manu-facturing trade deficit seems to be coming down. At this point, it's only about half as large as a share of G.D.P as it was at the peak of the housing bubble, and further improvements are in the pipeline. The Boston Consulting Group, which is now predicting a U.S. "manufacturing renaissance," points to major U.S. firms like Caterpillar that once shifted production abroad but are now moving it back. At the same time, companies from other countries, especially European firms, are moving production to America.

As one potential disaster had been avoid: the U.S. auto industry, which many people were writing off just two years ago, has weathered the storm. In particular, General Motors has now But that may be changing. had five consecutive profitable

America's industrial heartland in now leading the economic recovery. In August 2009, Michigan had an unemployment rate of 14.1 percent, the highest in the nation. Today, that rate is down to 10.3 percent, still above the national average, but nonetheless a huge improvement.

First, what's driving the turn around in our manufacturing trade? The main answer is that the U.S. dollar has fallen against other currencies, helping give U.S.-based manufacturing a cost advantage. A weaker dollar, it turns out, was just what U.S. industry needed.

Yet the Federal Reserve finds itself under intense pressure from the right to make the dollar stronger, not weaker. A few months ago, Paul Ryan, the chairman of the House Budget Committee, berated Ben Bernanke for failing to tighten monetary policy, declaring: "There is nothing more insidious that a country can do to its citizens than debase its currency." If Mr. Bernanke had given in to that kind of pressure, manufacturing would have continued its


The Supreme Court Requires Equal Representation

Ever since 1962, the U.S. Supreme Court in Baker v. Carr, and Wesberry v. Sanders (1964) that voters in legislative and congressional districts should have approximately the same weight in casting their votes under a rule hat came to be known as "one person, one vote."

A few years later, the Supreme Court ruled thatit Midland County Texas could not keep using three County Commissioner Districts for 10,000 rural residents while providing only one Commissioner for the 90,000 citizens of the City of Midland in a case known as Midland vs. Avery. The earlier decisions and Midland v. Avery were applied later to Lubbock and other cities to create single member districts that in Lub-

physically adjoining as in square or oval shapes or drawn in ways that do not prejudice ethnic minorities or "communities" of interest be they agriculture or business interests, housing and school districts. However, federal courts have not overturned cases involving snake-like gerrymandered districts that in North Carolina created a district along Interstate 40 that maintained a congressional district with a Black Democratic Congressman; in Texas, the all-Republican Texas Supreme Court

and the Fifth Circuit Court of Appeals in New Orleans upheldd 2003 efforts of Gov. Perry and Atty. General that tried to eliminate Lloyd Doggest a Liberal Democrat representing Austin and Travis County by pitting him against a Hispanic Democrat in a clear case of "packing." Fortunately, Doggettwas able to win but many other Hispanic and white state legislators such as Democratic Minority leader Jim Dunnam of Waco lost their seats to Tea Party candidates in 2010.

Some Impacts of Population Shifts on the Proposed Models

In two Models prepared by a Waco Law Firms employing Baylor Law School professors, there was an effort to create six districts close to the "ideal" of 38,292 persons each. The proposed maps recognized not only the growth of the city but also the demographic shifts in the population out of North and East Lubbock into South and Southwest Lubbock..

Council Districts have changed significantly since 2000. District One (Victor Hernandez) in 2010 had 19,999 Hipanic residents (51.4%) and 11,808 whites (35.7%) for a total of 33,096. in District Two, Floyd Price had 18,679 Hispanics (56.3%), 8,855 Blacks - (26.7%), and 5,230 Whites (15.8%) in a total of 33,149 residens. Todd Klein (District Three) now had 10,803 Hispanics (29.9%0 and 21,872 whites (60.5%0 in a population of 36,120. Following the rational of previous court decisions and the law, District One voters had a greater weight in the Council than voteers in other districts. Jim Gilbreath in District Six represented 35.4% more voters thn Hernandez --obviosly unequal representation. Shifting District Lines Has a Domino Effect on More than **One District** Under proposed Model One, Hernandez will represent 39,489 voters, with a potential 21,678 Hispanic voters (54.9%) with 1,679 more Hispanic residents out of an additional 6,393 residents. The deviation between Hernandez Distict and Gilbreath district would be 2,823 voters or a 7.3% difference. In Model Two, Hernandez would represent 38,519 citizens. In proposed Model One, Floyd Price would incorporate Precinct 24 (Wheelock Elementary) and thus represent 39,273 voters, with 759 more Blacks, 67 fewer Hispanics and 10,638 more whites totalling 38,691. Transferring the 4,513 residents in the Wheelock area back to Klein's District would create a District with 41,795 voters or a 9.1% deviation from the "ideal"

38,292 persons. Therefore, some 2,866 persons in Klein's new district would have to be moved into an adjoining district to reduce the deviation in citizen numbers from other residents in the district whose childre attended Wheelock and Hutchiso Middle School.

While the proposed districts were relatively contiguous and compact, the mostly white voters of Hillcrest Neighborhood (part of Precinct One voting at Wolfforth) are cut off by Northwest Loop 289 where its mostly Hispanic citizens vote. Bowie Elementary School (Precinct 7) is cut off by the Marsha Sharp Freeway from the rest of Karen Gibson's District Five which mostly lies to the south of the Freeway. Thus it is most likely that a few Precincts may be split so that a better balance or equality of population can be achieved.






