### Black Farmers Settlement Approved



John W. Boyd Jr. of the National Black Farmers Association was on Capitol Hill in September urging the Senate to act.

The House has given final Congressional approval to a bill that would provide more than \$4.55 billion to settle tens of thousands of longstanding claims brought by African Americans farmers and American Indians.

The bill provides \$1.15 billion to African Americans left out of a 1999 settlement of a lawsuit, *Pigford v. Glickman*, in that settlement the federal government agreed to compensate black farmers and would-be farmers who said Agriculture Department officials denied or cheated them out of federal aid. To be eligible for money now, claimants must have farmed or attempted to farm between 1981 and 1986, have filed a discrimination complaint before July 1, 1987, and have filed a claim after the deadline in the original settlement.

The bill provides another \$3.4 billion to American Indian plaintiffs who claim that Interior officials mismanaged royalties from leases of tribal land used to harvest oil, minerals and timber. Plaintiffs will receive \$1.4 billion directly, while the government will use \$2 billion to repurchase Indian lands broken up under the Dawes Act in the late 19th and early 20th century.

Another \$60 million will fund scholarships for American Indian students.

Representative James Clyburn, the majority whip, said the bill helped right historic injustices.

"Today we removed the stain on our country's history and rectified these injustices," he said, thanking several Republicans for helping with the bill. "What happened to our nation's African American farmers and Native Americans was wrong, and we have made it right."

The vote in the House was 256-152. President Obama is expected to sign it soon.

In a statement Tuesday, Mr. Obama applauded the bill's passage, and pledged to continue efforts to resolve similar claims brought by women and Hispanic farmers. "Yet, while today's vote demonstrates important progress, we must remember that much work remains to be done," he said.

While members of both parties have said they supported compensation for the farmers and the Native Americans, some Republicans oppose the bill. Representative Michele Bachman has claimed that the black farmers' suit was "rife with fraud" because there more

claimants than there are black farmers. And Representative Steve King, Republican of Iowa, has called the case a form of reparations for slavery.

John W. Boyd Jr., the president of the National Black Farmers Association, countered that the dwindled number of black farmers was a result of the discrimination patterns alleged in the suit.

"This case ain't got a thing to do with fraud," he said Tuesday. "It's about a group of black farmers complaining about what

### MLK Little League Needs Your Support


The MLK Little League Baseball is in the process of beginning its 2011 Baseball Season.

### Rev. Al Sharpton Inaccurately Portrayed by New York Daily News



From the Desk of Parson D.A. Smith  
**China, Iran & You!**

Sometimes as Americans we become so intangible with what's happening on the home front or in our immediate environment that we take our eyes off the real problems that surrounded us.

The idea mention appears to have exploded during the days leading up to the national mid-term election.

American of all walks of life tend to become so involved in the politics of self preservation that we begin to chew each other up while the rest of the world have been steadily creating ways and environments that will make us a third rate nation and in a weaken state succumb to those who for years have been vying to be the world's top dog.

Nations like Iran and China would like to be the leaders of the world. Iran would like to become and is on the verge of becoming the nuclear superpower. China has already puts itself in position to be the economic leader and will use the North Koreans like the rich white males did the morons of the Tea Party to be their police of the

world while keeping their hands clean.

It's a scenario China has sought to prevent. Only four months ago, Chinese officials and military officers shrilly warned Washington against sending carrier into the Yellow Sea for an earlier set of exercises. Some said it would escalate tensions after the sinking of a South Korean navy ship blamed on North Korea. Others went further, calling the carrier deployment a threat to Chinese security.

Beijing believes its objections worked. Although Washington never stated why, no aircraft



was done to them and seeking justice."

The House has attached funding for the settlements to larger legislation twice, only to see it stripped out in the Senate over cost concerns. After months of wrangling, Senate lawmakers approved the settlements on Nov. 19 as a separate measure.

The Senate legislation also provides more than \$1 billion to settle four water rights cases brought by American Indian tribes and extends for one year the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families program, which helps states provide cash assistance and other services to the poor.

The money for the settlement will come out of funds from a surplus in nutrition programs for women and children, higher fees for customs activity and a Treasury program to recover overpaid unemployment benefits.

## In Cinque

anything can tell you that cut the Medicare cost

The holidays cannot approach us fast enough. The scammers are very busy this time of year spreading their kind of cheer; the kind that could land an innocent person in jail and in debt. Personally, I am glad that I can read a little bit and have a suspicious inquisitive mind, in addition to not being a greedy person.



All of us, by nature are overjoyed when we encounter a situation which will make our financial burdens a bit lighter, but some of our encounters are of the illegal scamming kind. I had one on yesterday. I received a letter without a return address. Naturally, I opened it and found inside to my amazement, a check for \$3,579.00 to be drawn on C & T CONSULTANTS, INC., at 540 Madison Avenue in New York, NY 10022. The letter head was printed for EURO-AMERICAN PUBLISHING HOUSE, INC. at the same address as the C & T CONSULTANTS, INC. Underlined, the salutation was FROM THE DESK OF THE MANAGING DIRECTOR OF PRIZE AWARD DEPARTMENT. It was dated and had a reference number. From a pool of 3 Million Dollars, my ticket drew the lucky numbers which won a prize of Fifty Three Thousand Five Hundred cash dollars which is credited to my reference number, and they had been trying to contract me for three months. This was the final notice. I read on that as a part of their security protocol to avoid misconduct or doubling claiming, this award had to be kept confidential until the claim is confirmed. The next paragraph explained how I would have to deal with their North American

agency and insurance company since they did not deal directly with the public and that the check is part of my winnings and has been sent to me to cover the Government Service Tax and processing charges, which total \$2,981 to be paid to WESTERN UNION payment system. I was to call my agent, Tracy Jones at 1-647-836-4180 to activate my claim before I deposited the check at my bank; this was very important.

I re-read the letter, knowing that I had not bought any sweepstakes for an October drawing. I also noticed that the letter was NOT written with a salutation to me. It was a kind of form letter. When the discussion of confidentiality was involved, a red flag went sky high. I felt the confidence that that this is surely a hoax and decided to examine the check. It was authentic in every sense of the word. No VOID evidence anywhere on it. The back and front of the check had the security lock feature with the details on the back: micro printing, watermark and colored background. I looked for the name of the bank issuing the check and I have not found it yet. It is invisible. A good check is issued on a bank and some of the scammers had gotten their fingers on some bank's checks, so if you get one, knowing that you have not

As the Executive Director of OBG Adventure Camps, a travel and learning adventure program for girls 11-16, Friley was gearing up for her very first camp experience that would journey to a beachfront campground location in the United States Virgin Islands, and she was stressed. "I didn't know if I could pull it off," says Friley. "I'd been planning this program for many years knowing that it can be very difficult for many parents of color to trust and let their children go off to camp, particularly when camp involves travel. But in the end, I managed to get it done." And get it done she did.

With two successful camp sessions under her belt - having taken place in both the US Virgin Islands and California's Lake Shasta - Friley and her qualified team are now gearing up for the 2011 season with CampCaribe 2011 where diverse girls from around the nation will participate in a multicultural camp experience, environmental engagement, cultural appreciation, beach, land & water activities, and a fantastic dolphin encounter in the Caribbean sea. "This time," laughs Friley, "the twitch in my eye isn't so bad."

Friley's twitch has calmed down a bit because she believes that steps are being made in The Outdoor Movement as it relates to diversity. Not only does the White House have outdoor and

healthy lifestyle initiatives in place, but America's First Daughter Malia Obama set an example for tween girls of color when she went to camp for the first time this past summer, and even Oprah Winfrey and her bosom buddy Gayle took up Park Ranger Shelton Johnson's offer to go camping and road tripped to Yosemite National Park for all of the world to see. "When the public sees African-American girls and women enjoying the Great Outdoors, we hope that it sends the message that outdoor recreation is for everyone," laments Alley Bailey, an OBG Adventure Camps staff member and one of two African-American lifeguards on staff. "This is good stuff."

American Camp Association statistics indicate that less than 11% of campers in the independent camp sector are in minority groups. Shelton Johnson, the African-American park ranger that invited Oprah to Yosemite has this to say on CNN.com: "African-Americans today are least likely to have a wilderness experience, but we descend from people who were most likely to have intimacy with the land."

Likewise, Last Child in the Woods author Richard Louv has coined the phrase 'Nature Deficit Disorder' to describe the lack of outdoor engagement by today's youth. And Friley only knows too well about these truths. "I had a number of adults upon seeing my girls engaging in beach and waterfront fun ask me if my group was at-risk. People just aren't used to seeing a group of diverse girls traveling to and hanging out in such a high end island environment."

Because of these types of comments, because there is a dramatic shift in the nation's demographics and because camp helps kids gain independence, build character and develop critical thinking and social skills, camp programs like Friley's that reach out to girls of color are critical.

Vanessa Sanchez, a social worker and another member of the OBGAC staff, agrees. "As a triathlete and camping addict, I don't see as much diversity as I would like. Programs with like this that reach out to children of color are critical to a child's overall development. When Tracey asked me to participate, it was a no-brainer. I couldn't say no."

With Malia, Oprah & Gayle leaving camp behind and moving on to their next adventure, Friley remains optimistic in spite of the stats. Her non-profit grassroots adventure program, which is going into its second year, enrolls a majority of African-American Adventurers although she's determined to make the program more multicultural in the years to come. "In my ideal world, I'd like OBG Adventure Camps to represent the world we live in," says Friley, the only Brown Girl at camp growing up. "Empowering African-Ameri-

can children is a priority, but a program that is an accurate representation of the world we live in would be just perfect."
