The Citizens Registration League met on Friday, January 10, 1964, at 7:00 PM for the purpose of coordinating the various branches within the community in an all out effort to qualify citizens


Last Tuesday, the 4th king that an amendment - Amendment was on the ballot favoring a run-off in any colse election. It further stated that a candidate must have the majority vote.


