## Dunbar Clashes With Austin's Anderson High Friday

### New Program Integrates City Jr High Football

Lubbock has done it again! This year the Athletic Program of the Junior High Schools will add another attraction to the sport of football. There will be a City Football League composed of each Junior High School in our city, making Lubbock the first city in the state of Texas to intergrade schools for such a program. Each school will have a nine game schedule, and each game will be held at Lowery Field.

The program will certainly help to build a strong football program for each High School in the city. Instead of a boy preparing for the "B" squad, he will have the opportunity of orientating himself on the Junior High School squad with all the fundamentals he will be using on the B squad and A squad.

The Dunbar Cubs, Junior High, will play their first game in the City Football League against R. W. Matthews Junior

All fans who love the sport of football are eagerly awaiting the results of the opening game between Dunbar High School and Anderson High of Austin.

This week the Panthers journeyed to the State Capitol, Austin, to open their eight game schedule with Anderson High School. As you can recall last year Austin defeated Dunbar 12-7.

Coach James F. Hillyer, head coach of the Panthers, feels that the Panthers are as ready as can be expected for the first game. He stated that he lost nine lettermen from last year's State Runner-up Squad, but the future for the Panthers looks rather bright.

According to the Panthers schedule for 1963 there are only three home games, of those three only one is a district game, this game being with our annual rival, Amarillo.

The coaches for this year's Panther squad are James F. Hillyer, head coach; Louis Kelly, ba-

ckfield coach; and Pre-nis Williams, line coach. The coaches of this year's "B" squad are Donald George and Charles Alexander. Coaches for the newly formed Junior High School squad are Perch Hines, former All American at Tennessee A&I; and Curtis Gipson.

Sr. High School, enrolled in the Lubbock Vocational School of Nursing in September, 1962. Miss Mitchell was secretary-treasurer of her class, and was awarded for having perfect attendance. She graduated third in the class with an average of 95.

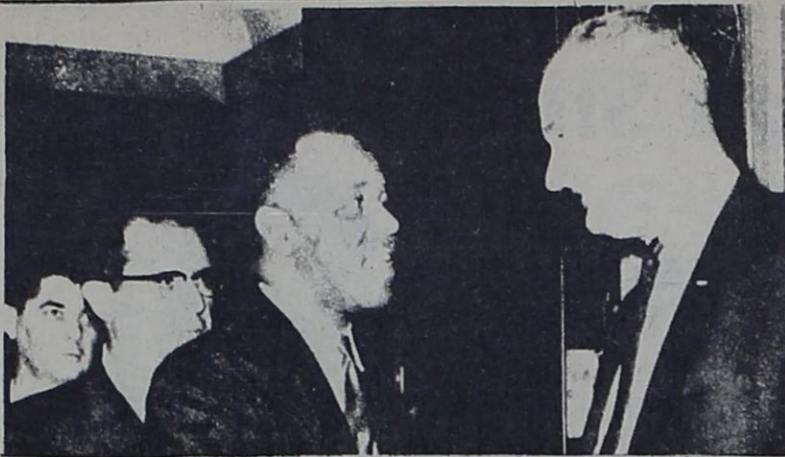

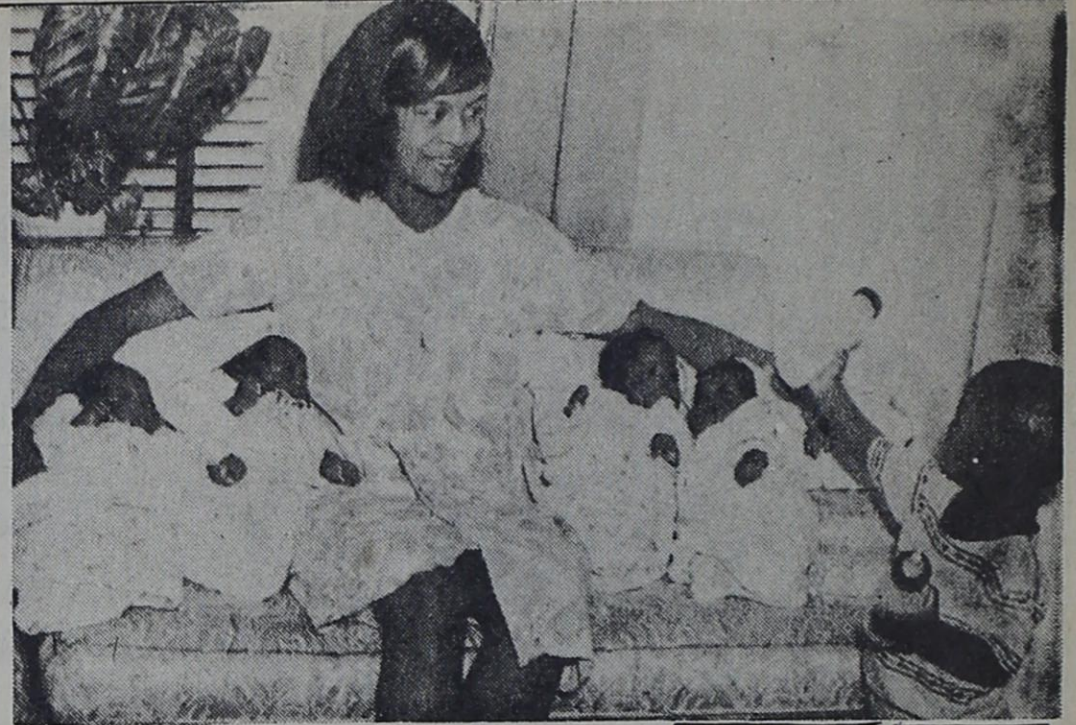
