## Boy Scout Week to Be Observed Feb. 7th - 13th

The anniversary of the chartering of the Boy Scouts of America, Feb. 8, 1910, is observed every year by the members of the organization. This year the anniversary will be celebrated Feb. 7 through Feb. 13.

Boy Scouts all over the world will take part in special ceremonies, repeat the Scout oath and review their history.

What is scouting and who are Boy Scouts? The organization of boys into the society of scouts is due to Sir Robert S. S.

Baden-Powell, an English army officer. While serving in South Africa he wrote a book called "Aids to Scouting." When he returned to England, he found his book was being used in the schools to help in character training. He decided to form a company of seven or eight boys and call them Boy Scouts. This was in 1908 and out of this grew the scout movement which spread rapidly throughout England.

William D. Boyce, a Chicago publisher, was in London on a foggy day in 1908, when he was helped by a young boy who was passing. When the boy refused money, replying, "A Scout never takes money for courtesies," Mr. Boyce was curious. The boy told Mr. Boyce of the British Boy Scout Association and carried him to the headquarters. At the office he learned from Sir Robert Baden-Powell about the Scout organization. Mr. Boyce returned to America and early in 1909 started the organization of the Boy Scouts of America. The perma-

## Lubbock Man, T. J. Patterson in Viet Nam for Service

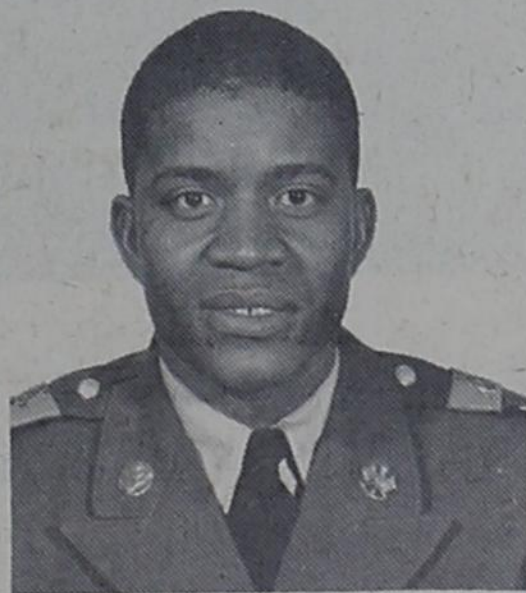
Cpl. T. J. Patterson has been sent to Viet Nam for duties in services of the U. S. A.

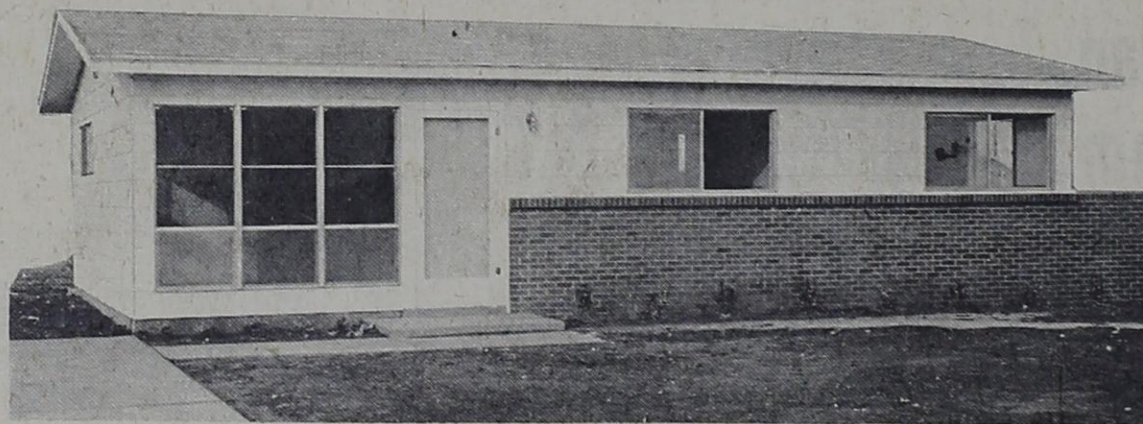

 nent organization was perfected and chartered under the laws of the District of Columbia on Feb. 8, 1910.

Before 1910 there were two organizations intended to interest boys in wholesome things. One was Ernest Thompson Seton's "Woodcraft Indians" and the other was Dan C. Beard's "Sons of Daniel Boone." These were incorporated into the Boy Scouts of America when it was chartered, as the Boy Scout movement was based on a broader foundation.

Boys from twelve to eighteen years of age are eligible for membership and on admission they take the Scout oath. There are three, or possibly four classes of scouts, tenderfoot, second class and first class. The possible fourth comprises the Eagle Scouts who are those who have won twenty-one merit badges. The Scout law requires a boy to be trustworthy, loyal, helpful, friendly, courteous, kind, obedient, cheerful, thrifty, brave, clean and reverent.

The Boy Scouts of America are directed by a national council with headquarters in New York. The country is di-
