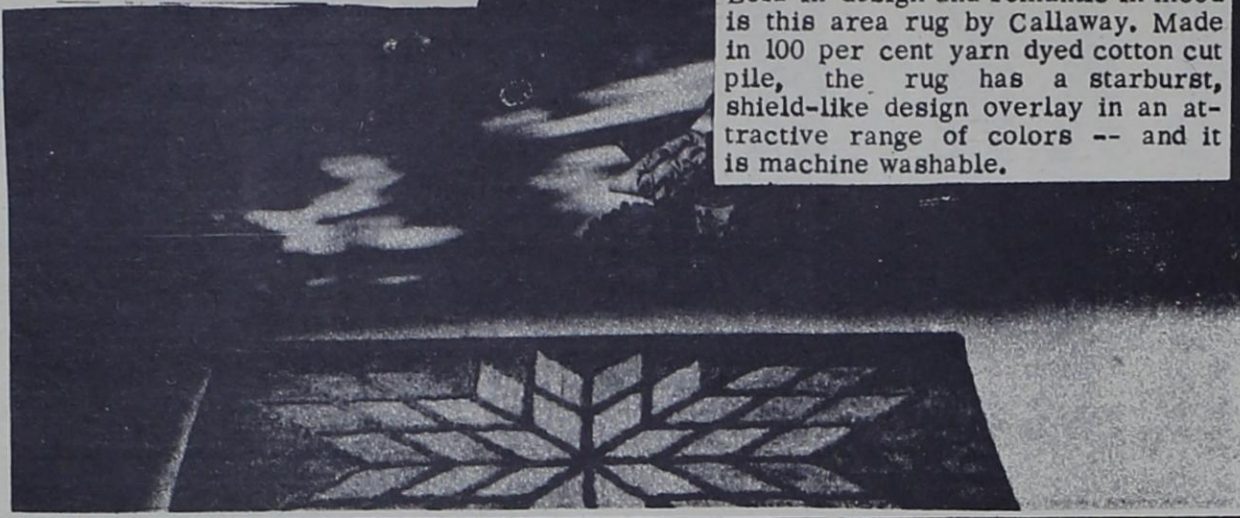

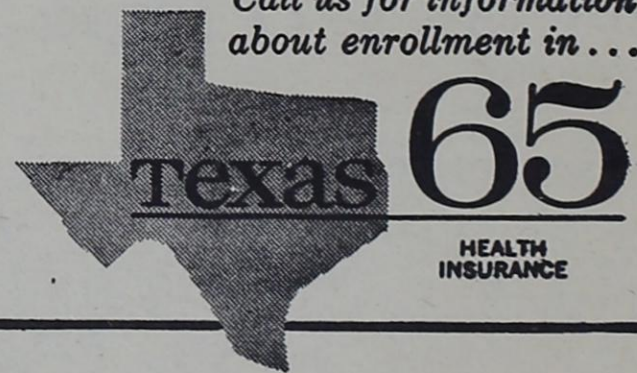

The money will be used to help improve facilities and the quality of education offered by the 32 colleges in the fund thereby bringing into the national force more trained, educated and qualified Negro applicants.

In making the donation, Mr. Magowan said that he and Mrs. Magowan, as trustees of the Charles E. Merrill Trust, were very happy to recommend to our Nation's guarantee of educational equality for all citizens.

Mr. Magowan, while emphasizing that the primary policy of Safeway is the efficient distribution of food at the lowest possible cost to the consumer, insists that all divisions of the corporation give more than lip service to the company's long-standing policy of non-discrimination in its employment policies.

Magowan spoke in July of this year to a meeting of the food chain's top level officials held at Oakland, California headquarters. He told them that in selecting candidates for positions, "There shall be no discrimination in employment because of race, religious creed, ancestry, national origin, or political or fraternal affiliation. All those who interview applicants for employment and all advertisements, circulars, or other publica-

tions relative to employment, shall avoid questions, statements or words that are discriminatory."

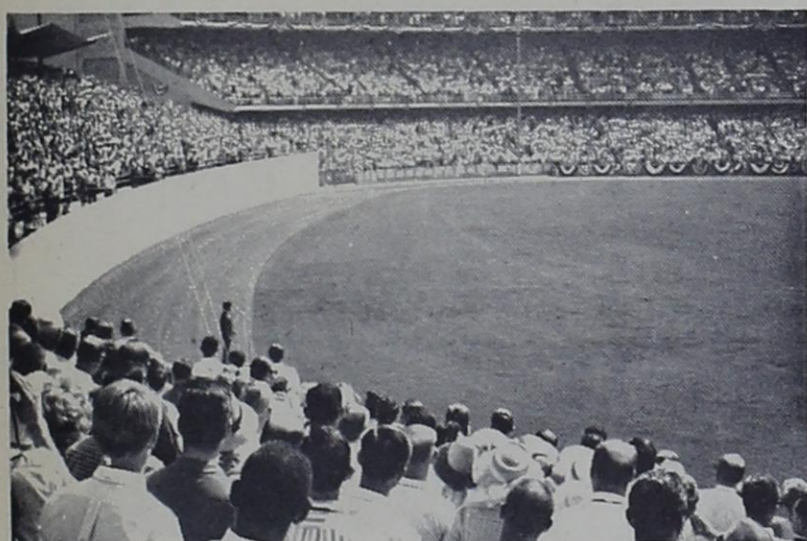

- 2 broiler-fryer chickens, halved
- 2 large onions, coarsely chopped
- 2 green peppers, chopped
- 2 tomatoes, coarsely chopped
- 2 teaspoon salt
- 1 tablespoon each curry powder, ground coriander, ground cumin
- 1 teaspoon turmeric
- 1/2 teaspoon cinnamon
- 1/2 teaspoon garlic powder
- 1 teaspoon black pepper
- 1/4 pound butter, melted
- 2 cups water

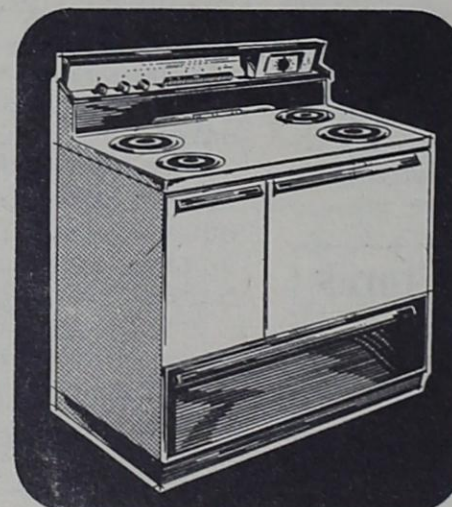
