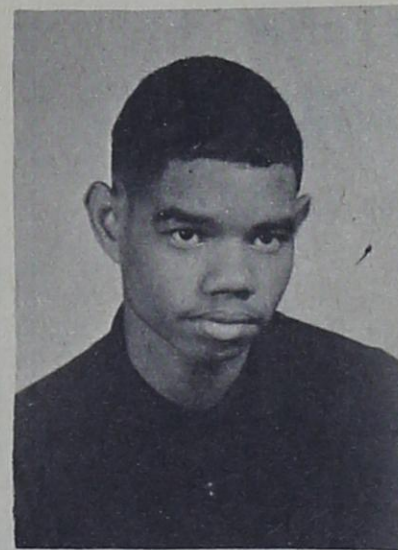


### Robert Pillow To Workshop

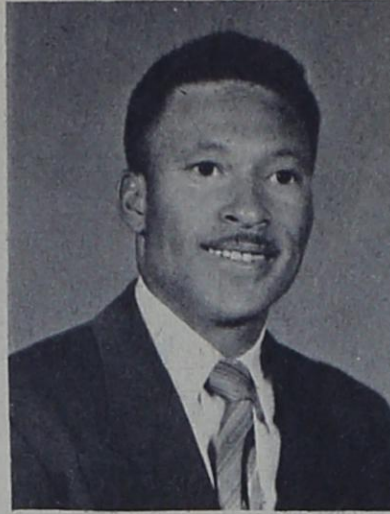

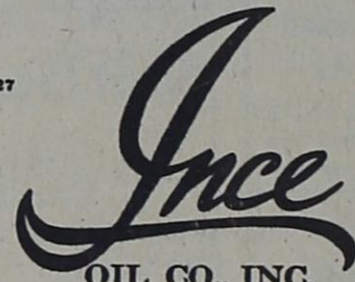

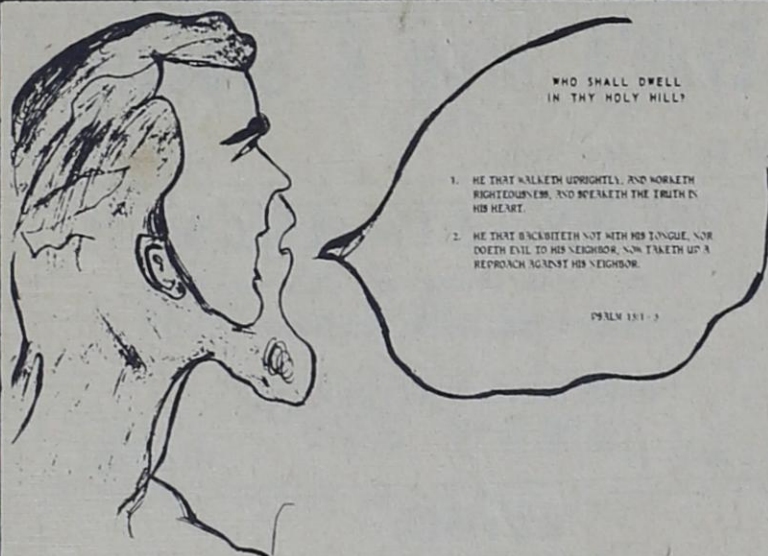
