
## Gov. Conally Names City Doctor to Board

### Jim Crow Schools Lose Federal Cash

Washington - A situation that would have resulted in the federal government building integrated on-base schools for children of military personnel, while at the same time paying segregated school districts to provide teachers and run them was averted last week following a public outcry.

Health, Education and Welfare Secretary Anthony J. Celebrezze issued a statement clarifying an earlier order that stated HEW and the Department of Defense intend to provide "suitable" and integrated education for children at six military bases in the south which have refused to desegregate their local facilities.

Some 2,700 children in grades 1-6 are expected to be attending unsegregated on-base schools in an action taken under Public Law 874, "Impacted Area" public school program, which says the government must provide "suitable" education wh-


Rev. Collins came back to Lubbock in January, 1959. Since this duration he has been a faithful Missionary worker for all the churches in Lubbock.
