

Not radical left or right, just a radical, because this is a radical moment. It is a moment for rad-ical departures from business as ical departures from business as usual in so many areas. We can't thrive as a country any longer by coasting on our reputation, by postponing solution to every big problem that might involve pain and by telling ourselves that dramatic new initiatives-like a gasoline tax, national bealth care or banking reform-are too hard or "off the table." So my most fervent hope about President Obarna is that he will be as radical as this moment-that he will put everything on the be will put everything on the table.

the Harvard University political theorist. To ordinary times, the emergy and dynamism of American life reside in the econ-omy and society, and people view government with suspicion or indifference. But in times of national crisis, Americans look to government to solve funda-mental problems that affect them directly. These are times

when presidents can do say things. These moments are rare. But the offer the occasion for the kind of leadership that can

the kind of leadership that can recast the political landscape, and redefine the terms of point-cal argument for a generation. In the 1930s, the Great Depression enabled Franklin Roosevelt to launch the New Deal and redefine the role of the federal government, while in the 1960s, the assassination of John F. family members before turning the gun on himself. In a letter faxed to Los Angeles television station KABC before his suicide, Ervin Antonio Lupoe blamed his for-user employer for the deaths, tetaling his grievance against Kaiser Permanente's West Los Angeles Medical Center, where

he and his wife Ana had worked as technicians Lupoe claimed the couple was being investigated for "misrepresentation of our employ-ment to an outside agency for the benefit to surselves s [sic], childcare." He said the mittal interview was held on

December 19, and when he toported for work on December 23, "I was told by my administrator — that You should not trator that You should not even have bothered to come to work today. You should have blown your brains out."
"Oh lord, my God," the letter concludes "Is there no hope for a widow's son?"

Kaiser Permanente said in a statement Tuesday night that while the commany is "saddened."

statement Tuesday night that while the company is "saddened by the despair in Mr. Lupoe's letter faxed to the media — we are confident that no one told him to take his own life or the fives of his family."

The Lupoes' employment was terminated over a week ago "after an internal myestication."


