Entertaining usually means a roast because meat in a single large piece is easiest to prepare and makes a show-piece.
One of the most attractive roasts to serve is a pork loin, especially one that's dressed up with a rosy apple topping. It will take 3 to 4 hours to roast the pork, points out Reba Staggs, meat cookery expert, but the topping is spread on the meat only during the last 20 to 30
minutes.

## Pork Loin Roast Spicy Apple Topping

 4 to 6 -pound pork loin roast Salt and pepper Spicy Apple Topping Have backbone removed from loin. Season. Place fat side up Insert meat open roasting pan. Insert meat thermometer so bart. . What is the name of this cut of meat?
A. Pork Rib Chops.
Q. Where do they come from? How are they identified? They come from the loin section of pork. They have one muscle and may or may not have a rib bone, depending upon how thick they're cut. called boneless rib chops.
. How are they cooked?
A. Usually by braising or baking but they are also popular for grilling or broiling. Braising is a moist heat method that in its own fat or drippings before a small amount of moisture is added. After browning, the chops are seasoned, the cooking liquid is added and the pan is covered tightly. The cooking may be done on a surface unit or in the oven, but it must be done slowly for best results in flavor and appearance. Chops cut $\%$ to 1 -inch thick require 45 minutes to an hour for cooking time. Chops may be baked in a $325^{\circ} \mathrm{F} .-350^{\circ} \mathrm{F}$. oven. Grill or bake at a moderate temperature so that the chops are well done by the time they are browned.

Most rib roasts wear the short compact look these days because the retailer has removed the short ribs. As a result, the compact rib roast has approximately the same diameter as well as the same roasting time as a boned, rolled rib roast.
If the beef rib roast has been left with the ribs long, that is, 7 to 9 inches, it will require less roasting time than that roast which is compact and measures 5 to 7 inches.
