





And now, after America's 221 year history, the white ceiling to the highest land in office has been shattered. "That was history and I wanted to see it," William said. "I've seen a good many of presidents come and go." For 90-year-old Vennie

Jackson (this writer's high school English teacher) who grew up in Bullard, she was growing up in Bullard when blacks were not allowed to go in many places, like cafe's, hotels and restaurants: If blacks were there, Jackson said they were working on jobs no one else wanted.
