Buliock Said Texas Gained

More Jobs

STATES IN ADDR

Austin, Tx. -- State Comptroller Bob Bullock aid Comptroller Bob Bullock said last Thursday that Texas gained 134,800 jobs from September 1988 through August of this year, with the total number of non-tarm jobs hitting a record 6.8 million.

While the Border area had the highest rate of job growth, the Gulf Coast metropolitan areas accounted for more than one-third of all new jobs in Texas, Bullock reported.

"Chemical industry expansion and increased trade and manufacturing along the border have been leading the job growth in Texas over the past year," Bullock said. "Overall, the state's economic expansion remained on track providing new jobs, higher income and more state revenues."

The Plains region, covering the Panhandle and much of West Texas, was hit by oil company consolidations and reported job losses.

Twenty of the state's 28 metropolitan areas gained jobs during the state's 1989 fiscal year, according to Bullock's year-end economic report in November issue of Fiscal Notes, an award winning monthly publication of the Comptroller's office.

The live metropolitan areas with the highest rates of job growth were Laredo, up 5.2 percent; Brazoria, up

Defense Set-Aside

A three-year extension of the Minority Business contracting goal of the U.S. Defense Départment has been voted by Congress.

Due mainly to the percistent concern of U.S. Hep. Gus Savage, the program could boost Minority Business Enterprices by \$8 billion a year. This would exceed the combined amount of all other federal contracting with MBE's.

The outspoken Congressman pressed for the extension ca many levels la May, for example, he raised the issue directly with President Bush in a meeting with the Congressional Black Caucus. However. Savage gave much credit for the success to lobbying by a wide array of mainstream African American organizations, businesses, and institutions which he had helped to mobilize.

"This is not merely for Blacks and Hispanics," Savage contends. represents a victory for ell Americans, because justice and equality are All


American' principles. In 1986, he succeeded in winning, through the force of his debate, Congress' overwhelming approval of an amendment on the floor

of the House which first imposed the five percent goal on the defense budget. That department's budget constitutes almost one-third of the \$1 trillion annual federal budget.



Government Falls To Use Top Resource In War On Drugs

According to the Church of Scientolopy, the government is falling to use it's number one resource in the war on drugs - It's own people.

A recent Gallup Poll survey conducted in the USA, found that 75% of youths and 48% of adults are ready to volunteer time to drug prevention programs. There is a crying need for their help. One recent analysis put the number who could benefit from drug abuse treatment at 8.5 million with the number of slots for them at only 250,000. Adds to this the 47% failure rate in state funded drug rehabilitation Centres and it is hardly surprising that these same people are at a loss about what to do.

"The main complaint from the public is they don't know what the effective drug rehabilitation programs are or h ow to help." Said a spokesperson for the Church.







crime until the peoplein the community themselves decide they have had enough. When they ahve decided that they are going to shut it down, it will be shut down. The people know who the drug pusehrs are; they knew who the burglars, robbers, and thieves are; and when they decide that they have had enogh of it then we are going to see a chang.

We're seeing changes take place all across the state of Texas because of this. We're seeing the people themselves getting involved and makin changes not just in this area but all over.

We're gathered in fron of a house located (3302 East Baylor) where crugrelated violence took place, and we are see changes from that.

I have some recommendations I'm going to make and I have a 16-Point Plan, it's not a perfect plan to try to bring about a frug-free Texas but a plan that is based on my experince of working in law enforcement for a long period of time. I have several points in this plan I want to talk about today. And I hope they will have a favorable impact in trying to solve thses terrible problems. Again, I say they are not perlect propositions.

Fist the Drug Busters Program - a program model after our Crime Stoppers Program and after the IRS Intercept What we Program. propose is thatwhen a drug pusher is turned in; that the person that actually give us the information and helps cease that drug pursher's assets ... 10-percent of the ceased asset goes to that person. Attemping to do wedge between the drug pushers and the diug user. Also to establish a 2000 Foot Drug-Free Zone Area around our schools to keep out drug pushers. Anyone caught within that 2000 foot radious selling durgs will receive a mandatory jail or prison ter with no chance at probation or poroil. We will try to strickly inforce that rule. We are going to try and stop our young people from selling drugs and carring those pocket pagers which allows them







S. exhibitions, Lane has also had shows in Europe, Mexico and Canada.

In addition to Ms. Winfrey and Ms. Carroll, Artis Lane's work is in the collections of Quincy Jones, Bill Cosby. Sidney Poitier, and Miles Davis, among others. In additino, she has painted or sculpted by commission Barbara Bush, Armand Hammer, Cary Grant, Dr. Jerry Buss, Mrs. Henry Kissinger and Mrs. Walter Annenberg. While the work of African-American artists is beginning to finally get serious recognition within art collecting circles in the U. S., the marketplace still ram ins underserved in some key areas. First and foremost, there has existed a shortage of quality opportunities for African-American artists to have their works appreciated and valued. This has resulted in both a

general lack of awareness of major Black artists by consumers and the difficulty in general access to the artwork.

The M. Hanks Gallery, through its extensive contacts among the leading Black artists, was created to establish a new network between these underutilized yet important artists and a new informed public. In addition to hosting exhibitions by artists from all over

the U S., the M. Hanks Gallery has also embarked in an effort to bring the art to the American public through a newly launched series of high quality posters and soon a limited edition collection by its featured artists.

The first step, according to Eric Hanks, director of teh

to Erick Hanks, director of the Santa Monica-based gallery, is to eradicate some

of the myths concerning African-American art. Hanks lists four mejor popularly-held myths: 1) All African-American art is an expression of anger and hate. 2) All African-American art is figurative. 3) African-American artists are not formally trained. 4) African-American art is not collectable. Hanks points to artists such as Sam Gilliam,


