Paul Quinn College sues association over accreditation

Paul Quinn College has taken its fight for survival to

A day after losing an appeal for accreditation, the southern Dallas school filed suit Tues-Dattas school filed suit Tues-day in Atlanta federal court restore its Irfeblood member-ship in the Southern Associa-tion of Colleges and Schools. The 137-year-old PaulQuinn.

North Texas' only historically black college, needs accredita-tion to award degrees and for its students to receive financial

But in June, the association revoked that endorsement, concluding that the school had failed to meet one educational standard, and two financial ones. Paul Quinn appealed, saying the problems had been

corrected and the association's decision was based on maccurate or incomplete information. A 12-member appeals committee agreed with the association's contract of the contrac

mittee agreed with the associa-ation, a private group that accredits colleges in 11 states. In sung the association Tues-day, Paul Quinn said the group, violated its due process rights and would cause the school "catastrophic and irreparable barm;" if its accreditation is not reinstated

"In fact, and without hyper-bole. SACS's improper act could be the college's 'death knell,' "the lawsuit said.

Hyannis Port, Mass., of brain cancer at age 77. Kennedy had a malignant glioma, a type of brain cancer. A glioma is a brain tumor that begins in glial cells, which are cells that surround and support

In a statement posted on Kennedy's senate web site, the Kennedy family says, "We've lost the irreplaceable center of our family and joyous light in our lives, but the inspiration of his faith, optimism, and perseverance will live on in our hearts forever We thank everyone who gave him care and support over this last year, and everyone who stood with him for so many years in his tireless march for progress toward jus-tice, fairness, and opportunity for all. He loved this country and devoted his life to servin it. He always believed that or best days were still ahead."

Semenya, South African, Is **Definitely Female, Says Family**

FAIRLIE, South Africa—
She wore pants instead of a skirt to school, played soccer with the boys and was teased about her inasculine looks.
Caster Semenya learned to ignore the taunts. She ran alone across a landscape of high mayers deried with

alone across a landscape of high grasses dotted with rocky hills. She came almost out of nowhere to win the world championship in the 800 meters Wednesday in Berlin, far and away the fastest woman on the track.

Or was she?

Or was she? Her time of 1 minute, 55.45 seconds was more than 2 sec-onds ahead of the second-place finisher, but now Semenya's gender is the subject of an in-

gender is the subject of an in-ternational investigation.
Even before Berlin, track of-ficials were taking a closer look at the 18-year-old runner, following her performance last month at an international meet where she improved her per-sonal bests in the 800 and 1,500 meters by huge margins.
Her family is outraged at suggestions that Semenya, who has a muscular build and a deep voice, isn't a woman.





LOS ANGELES (AP) -

A judge on Tuesday sentences Chris Brown to five years' probation and six months' community labor for the beating of Rihanna and issued a stern admonition to the R&B

Los Angeles Superior Court Judge Patricia Schnegg told Brown that he could be sent to state prison if he violated any terms of his sentence, in cluding an order to stay away from Rihanna for the next five

years.

Brown will serve his sentence in his home state — Virginia — and his community labor will be overseen by the chief of police in Richmond. The judge said she wanted to ensure that Brown, 20, performs physical labor instead of community service, such as mentoring young people. Rihanna did not attend. Tuesday's sentencing.
