Leland Withdraws Name From Impeachment Resolution

Washington -- Rep. Mickey Leland (D-TX) last week announced his decision to withdraw his name from the resolution calling for the impeachment of President Ronald Reagan for violating the United States Constitution when he ordered the invasion of Grenada.

Leland had joined six of his colleagues in introducing the impeachment resolution following the deaths of U. S. Marines and Grenadian citizens. "I was deeply distressed about the U. S. military intervention and occupation in Grenada. The use of military force against Grenada, with whom we are not at war, violated constitutionally-mandated Congressional war-making powers apart

from existing international treaties and international law," said Congressman Leland.

"The President's action in Grenada was meant to take attention away from the crisis situation which exists in Lebanon. My

reasons for signing on to the resolution were impulsive. The loss of lives was unjustifiable.

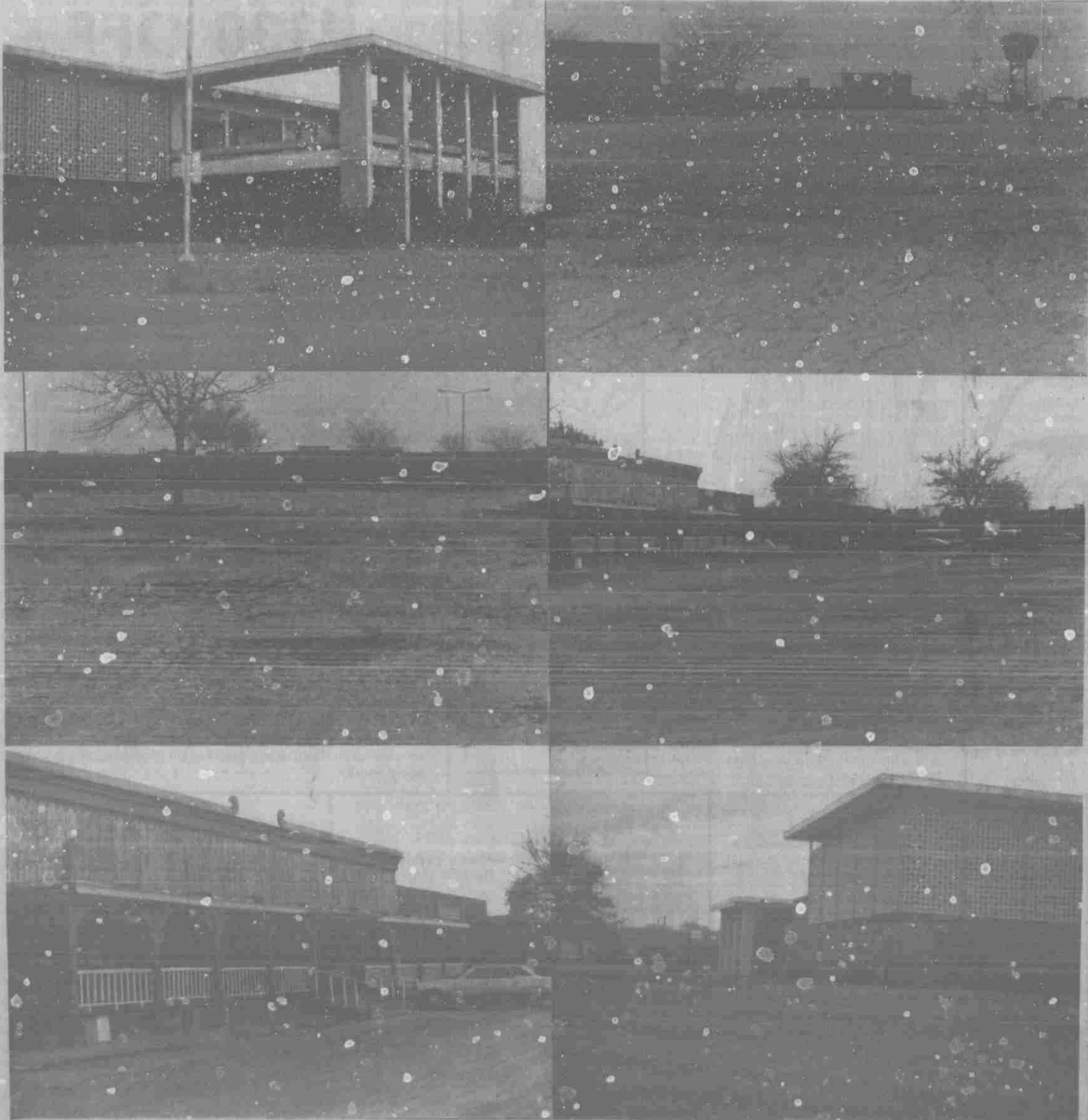

"No Babysitting Service," Says Ms. Ervin

"This is not a babysitting service for parents to leave their children," were remarks made by Ms. Joan Y. Ervin, chairperson of the Black Advisory Committee of the Lubbock Public Schools, last Saturday morning at Ella Iles Elementary School. Ms. Ervin, speaking to about fifty parents, told them this program is for any student who needs assistance in reading. "We don't care what color the child is, we want to help the child or children learn to read," she said. "We will not be a disciplinary center for your children," she said. "We will work all we can with your child or children, but we will need your help. Please, Mom and Dad, don't use this time each Saturday to do your chores and forget about your child or children."

Dr. E. C. Leslie, superintendent, spoke to the group of parents briefly. He told them how

great this effort was and their help is needed. "If this continues, in five years we will feel the impact of such a program," said Dr. Leslie. The reading program is designed to help those students who are reading below their grade level in school. The students will be tutored each Saturday morning, from 10 a. m. to 12 noon. Each session will begin with an introduction period, followed by a motivational period (pep talk) and the tutoring. Volunteers from the Black community have begun participating in the assisting in the program. A similar program is underway at Parkway Elementary School each Saturday morning.

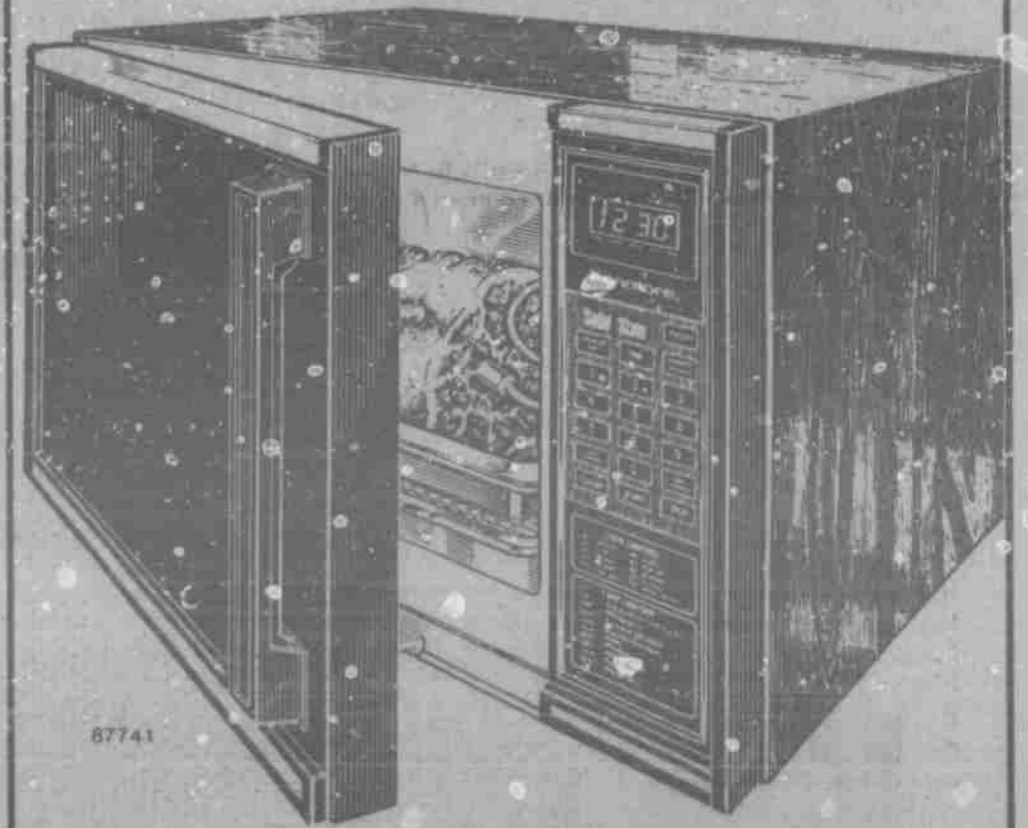

Social Security Tips

Earnings Test

One of the advantages of Social Security is that you don't have to stop working completely when you get monthly Social Security retirement payments. If you want to add to your Social Security income by doing some part-time or temporary work you can. Because if you're 65 to 70, you can earn as much as \$6,000 in 1983 without losing any of your benefits. If you're under 65, the amount you can earn and still get your full payment is \$4,920 this year. For every \$2 you earn over the exempt amount you lose \$1 in benefits. However, if you're 70 or older, there's no limit on your earnings. You can earn any amount and you'll still get your full Social Security payments. And, these additional earnings can mean higher benefits for you when they're added to your Social Security earnings record. If you have any questions, call any Social Security office.

If you get monthly Social Security checks, Social Security should have your correct address. So if you're planning to move, you should send them your new address and moving date. Even if you have direct deposit of your checks, Social Security must have your new address for their records so they can keep you informed of any changes in the law or other important announcements. You can call any Social Security office to report your change of address.

One of the changes made by the recent Social Security legislation is an increase in the tax rate starting next year. The tax rate for both employers and employees will be increased to 7 percent. However, a credit of 3/10 of a percent will be allowed against the employees' 1984 taxes. This means the Social Security tax rate for employees will be 6.7% for 1984, which is the same rate as this year's tax.

SEEK CULTURAL BOYCOTT OF BIAS MADE NATION.

ST. LOUIS, MO. — Randall Robinson, executive director of the DeCee based TransAfrica organization, which is bent on establishing closer ties between Afro-Americans and their root land, told a wall to wall audience in the Wilshire Ebell Theatre that "apartheid should be treated like a virus; isolated and stamped out." The affair was sponsored by Media Forum, a group concerned with building better images for tomorrow and was part of the ongoing drive of "Artists and Athletes to have all superstars shun South Africa and its self made state. It also focused a worded spotlight on Hollywood's alleged tacit contribution to apartheid in calling for a "Cultural Boycott of the Las Vegas style Sun (Sin) City entertainment complex setup in the so-termed independent Republic of Bophuthatswana."

Even though "BOP" and Sun City are supposed to be independent and the Minister of Commerce and Industry, Solomon Rathebe, said with a straight face, with a Bible in place, that they "abhor apartheid and that theirs is not racial society with a democratic government," they have a white (strange) way of showing it. The contradictions are obvious. The Bophuthatswana military hierarchy is made-up almost exclusively of whites, and they are not even citizens. The top level management of Sun (Sin) City is also lily white and make their beds and take their boards in South Africa and not "BOP". The holding nail in the coffin is that the State of Bophuthatswana is recognized by no other nation than South Africa. It is not even acceptable to the United Nations nor the United States, despite the Reagan Administration's conciliatory "constructive engagement" policy toward South Africa. So in the words of Randall Robinson: when you're in BOP, you're in South Africa. And to unquote, the most hate aching nation in the world. According to Duménil Matabane, the DeCee representative of the African National Council, while has been fighting apartheid for 72-yrs, Bophuthatswana's government is a sham. The place was founded by South Africa to keep it all white by creating a place where millions of black South Africans could be relocated and deprived of their citizenship.

The Republic of Bophuthatswana was established within the borders of South Africa in '77. Minister Rathebe is quoted as saying that Sun City is playing the part of a catalyst as far as changing attitudes. The number of super class stars who have performed there since its opening in '79 must have the same feeling. The list includes Frank Sinatra, Liza Minnelli, George Benson, Barry Manilow, Linda Ronstadt and Elton John, who was there in October, among others. Sammy Davis, Jr., has been offered big-bucks to perform there but is steadfast in his refusal. Actress Tyne Daly, TV's "Cagney & Lacey," spouse of Afro-American actor George Stanford Brown, was asked The Screen Actors Guild and The American Federation of Television & Radio Artists to follow the lead of the British Equity and refuse to allow the sale of TV shows to South Africa. In full vocal stride Min. Louis Farrakhan, of the Nation of Islam urged performers not to give "Their God-given gifts to the evil, wicked, powerbrokers of South Africa." He also warned them that while looking at the evils of apartheid they fail to see the dire effects of racism here in America.

Much of that is in the film industry of so Earl Bioness is pushing the City of Los Angeles to include an Affirmative Actions clause in its film permits. Earl is veep of Media Artists Against Discrimination, (MADD) for short, which has been credited with some long sought gains for minorities in the industry. The proposal was originally dumped into the lap of the Board of Public Works where the permit power lies. However, that body nixed the idea as too costly to enforce and a duplication of Federal regulations. The next move is up to Mayor Tom Bradley's ad hoc task force, but not before early '84... Friends of gridiron great O. J. Simpson are expecting him to make an aisle run with lovely Nicole Brown any day now. She has that sparkle in her eyes, on the right finger and is being introduced as "my fiancée"... Jimmy Harrison, exec. dir. N.U.A.B.A. Eastern Division and top Philly big tycoon, was hoping "war" did not come to Grenada. His son was set to graduate from St. George's U. in Feb. Now all that tuition money has gone up in the heat of battle... Dr. Chester Redhead, one of N.Y.'s top Doctors of Dental Surgery is deeply grieved by the turn of events, slain Prime Minister Maurice Bishop was related... Behind the Grenada Invasion Prez.

RRC Tells Congress Federal Bus Act Isn't Working

Austin, Tex. — In written comments sent to Congress this week, the Railroad Commission criticized the effects of federal bus legislation passed last year saying bus service has been reduced, the financial position of bus companies has worsened, and the regulatory process has been made more expensive and less meaningful. The Commission told the House Subcommittee on Surface Transportation that "the Bus Regulatory Reform Act of 1982 has failed to produce any of the benefits which its proponents have projected," and on the contrary, "has produced severe negative impacts on the states and their citizens."

The Commission statement also strongly criticized the Interstate Commerce Commission's enforcement of the act, charging "the ICC has played a shell game in which the rules are made up and changed along the way, concealed from the players, and applied in such a way to make the state role in bus regulation a farce. For those states, such as the state of Texas, which take pride on responsive and responsible motor bus regulation, the ICC's actions are an insult to the regulatory process and the public," the Commission said.

Before passage of the federal act last fall, the Railroad Commission had regulated bus service in the state since 1927 under the Texas Motor Bus Act. The Commission would carefully consider impact on the public before granting or denying applications to change or discontinue bus service or raise rates. With the Bus Regulatory Reform Act, however, the situation changed dramatically for the worse. State commissions have been severely limited in their ability to block unjustified route cancellations or fare increases. If such applications are denied by the state, the decision

can be appealed to the ICC which has the power to override.

According to the Railroad Commission, the ICC has been doing just that with alarming frequency. "Drastic reductions in service to small towns have occurred during the first year since passage of the BRRR and even more drastic future reductions are likely," the Commission pointed out. "The nation's largest bus carrier proposed to discontinue all service to over 1,000 cities and among them Oregon, California, Iowa, and Texas," the Commission said. "A blanket affirmations of such proposals were forthcoming from the ICC, other carriers have proposed discontinuances in other areas."

In Texas, Greyhound Bus Lines, Inc. applied to the Railroad Commission to cancel service to 58 cities. After Greyhound presented virtually no evidence to justify such a move, the Commission denied the application and Greyhound has appealed that decision to the ICC. Similar appeals by Greyhound from other states have been upheld. "With this encouragement from the ICC," the Commission told the subcommittee, "motor bus companies can be expected to discontinue service throughout Texas with impunity, without regard to whether such discontinuance is justified."

According to the Commission statement, the argument most often advanced by bus companies to justify their service cuts is that the service is not profitable. When state regulatory bodies have sought financial data to substantiate the claims, however, the bus companies haven't been willing or able to produce it. Worse, the ICC hasn't insisted on the data in its appellate review of cases.

"In a recent decision where the ICC granted a

bus company's application to discontinue service over the objections of the state, there was a question as to the accuracy of the methodology by which the bus company had calculated its financial data," the Railroad Commission said. "The ICC candidly admitted that it was not sure of the exact amount by which the carrier's expenses exceeded its revenues, but opined that it was probably a great deal. With such irresponsibility in the ICC's decisions, it is no wonder that the bus companies are irresponsible in their record keeping."

The Railroad Commission recommended several changes in the Bus Regulatory Reform Act and ICC rules and procedures and to the subcommittee. New grants of charter authority should be stopped and existing

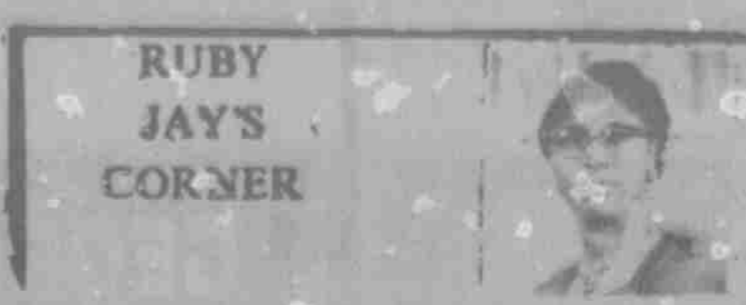

and my action was intended to focus attention to the Presidential abuse of his powers. I regret that my symbolic intentions have caused considerable concern among my constituents, yet I believe that the American people should focus attention on the issues surrounding armed intervention by American military forces into a sovereign nation. I still feel strongly that the President should have exercised peaceful negotiations in Grenada. The President's actions

have set a dangerous precedent for U. S. foreign policy in other areas of the world," said Leland.

"I realize that my initial action to introduce the resolution did not reflect the current mood of most Americans. However, the Constitution of the United States was not meant to apply only to its provisions enjoy majority support. We have a moral as well as legal and constitutional obligation as American citizens," concluded Leland.
