UCLA, conducted seminars for educators at the Lubbock Civic Center, in methods of teaching which are based on research.

Dr. Hunter introduced new concepts of teaching which can be utilized by new and experienced teachers alike. She emphasized the fact that there are no absolutes in teaching theories, but made it clear that there is high probability that most theories do work and that there is an art to putting educational theories into practice.

Many of Dr. Hunter's theories are the results of research and personal experiences in schools as teacher and a principal. She explained how the brain works to help teachers understand how children learn and therefore how to teach children so they will learn.

It was an exhilarating experience for teachers to gain insight on how to teach children without causing them to lose their dignity, regardless of their innate abilities.

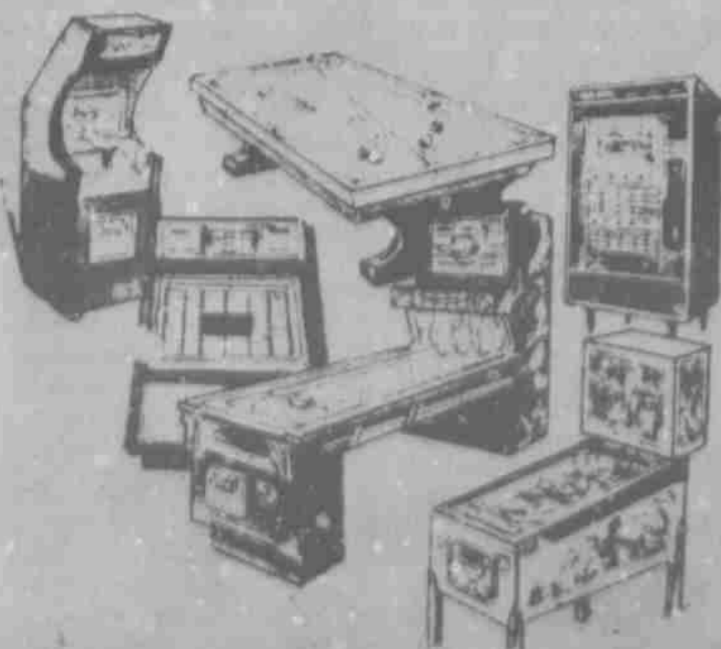

Savimbi Welcomed By Reagan and Black Cohorts

The slaughterer of Blacks, Jonas Savimbi, came to the United States seeking continued support for his vicious atrocities against Blacks in Angola, for the continuation of apartheid.

Jonas Savimbi, the leader of the National Union for the Total Independence of Angola (UNITA) which is a surrogate of South Africa, is now touring the United States to drum up continued military support from the Reagan Administration.

Savimbi, a native of Angola, is seeking to overthrow the Angolan government, which is recognized by all industrial countries except the United States and South Africa. Savimbi is as vicious to Blacks as the South African government. His men go through Angola often cutting off an ear, nose or a woman's breast or lips as warnings to others. Angola has more amputees per capita than any other country. These are caused by stepping on mines planted by the Savimbi forces. He has destroyed much of the farm land, causing a great shortage of food. Savimbi's soldiers burn villages

Grandmothers Against Drugs

Two fearless grandmothers decided one day that they were sick and tired of hearing about children being destroyed by drugs. They decided to do something about it, and despite the destructive pronouncements of psychiatrists that the concepts of right and wrong are outmoded, these two women decided to fight their battle against drugs in the old fashioned way, with ethnics and morals.

So the war began. Ayash founded the Concerned Businessmen's Association of America (CBAA), and Ferguson became the group's Executive Director. Their main weapon is the popular book "THE WAY TO HAPPINESS," which outlines a common sense, non religious moral code. Their objective is to GET DRUGS OFF SCHOOL GROUNDS by 1991. To do this the CBAA has sponsored annual cash award contests which require students to use the principles in "THE WAY TO HAPPINESS" to influence their peers in a positive manner, and away from drugs.

"THE WAY TO HAPPINESS" book", Ferguson says, "forwards time honored values such as honesty and trust, honor and help of parents, love and help of children, being temperate, not using harmful drugs, being competent, being industrious, fulfilling obligations, etc. The book contains practical know how for dealing with many areas of life."

To date, more than 3,000 schools representing every state in the country have participated in CBAA contests, and more than 500,000 students have distributed copies of "THE WAY TO HAPPINESS."

In explaining the importance of the program, Ms. Ayash tells a story about a mother of five children, three of whom were in serious trouble. According to Ms. Ayash, "One was using marijuana daily. One, a 14 year old girl, was pregnant. The other, 19, was serving time for car theft."

The mother had become upset when Ayash had stated that it is the parents' duty to teach their children moral values. The mother's disagreement sprung from a warning from a psychiatrist that imposing values on her children would stunt their individuality.

"The idea is idiotic," states Ms. Ayash, and despite such stupid ideas, Ayash believes "We will win this war because we continue to grow in numbers. The only real enemy we have to overcome is a lack of common sense. Drug dealers have no market with people armed with common sense morals."

after stealing food and supplies. They strip the people of their clothes, often raping and mutilating them, leaving them to wander searching for food and medical care.

Angola has a very rich supply of diamonds, phosphates, petroleum and salt. It also has a seaport and inland railroads, which would enable the surrounding states to ship their goods without having to depend on South Africa. Savimbi has destroyed the Angolan transportation system.

South Africa and the Reagan Administration emphasize that they are fighting Angola because it is a Marxist government. This is not true since Angola has American corporations operating there, without being under the control of the Angolan government, which is a Marxist trademark. Even if that were so, Marxists don't destroy, maim and kill innocent women and children.

Savimbi is aiding South Africa in its three goals: cheap labor; markets for South Africa's manufacturers; and competition in the provision of Southern Africa's vital raw materials.

On "60 Minutes", Savimbi said, "I can see the Executive President of South Africa as my friend. I consider him as my friend." In 1964, Savimbi criticized the National Front for the Liberation of Angola (FNLA) for its ties to the CIA, but he refused to join the Popular Movement for the Liberation of Angola (MPLA) because it refused to give him a top position. Savimbi then asked Moscow for assistance but it refused. After searching for help, he finally found support from China and adopted Marxist rhetoric. In 1966 Savimbi founded UNITA.

The Organization of African Unity (OAU), all leaders of the Southern Africa Frontline States, oppose U.S. aid to Savimbi. They call him "a known agent of apartheid South Africa responsible for the wanton killing of civilians." The OAU says, "Any American covert or overt involvement in Angola will be considered a hostile act against the OAU."

Bishop Desmond Tutu, Rev. Allan Boesak, Rev. Beyers Naude and all major anti-apartheid leaders and South African organizations strongly condemn U.S. support of Savimbi.

Leaders of major Black organizations called a press conference to denounce Savimbi. Randall Robinson, Executive Director of TransAfrica, said "Aid to Savimbi is aid to South Africa. We are here to reiterate our opposition to any aid for Savimbi, whose forces are fighting side by side with South African troops against the government of Angola. We are coming together to make sure the American people and especially, the Black community understand that Jonas Savimbi is doing South Africa's dirty work in Angola."

Savimbi is seeking the support of American Blacks. His visits consist of four Mississippi cities and Birmingham, Alabama. Charles Evers, the mayor of Fayette, Mississippi, presented Savimbi what Evers called the Medgar Evers Humanitarian award. Merlie Evers, wife of the slain Medgar, strongly disassociated herself and her husband from the award. The award really denigrates the name and work of Medgar Evers, who was a nonviolent fighter for the freedom of Blacks from the throes of vicious Whites. Savimbi's work is just the opposite, Jonas Savimbi, who is fighting for the continuation of vicious White supremacy, maims, tortures, and kills Blacks who want freedom.

For the past three years, Savimbi has switched his strategy. He has been working to penetrate the Black community. The stakes are high in this new political game. This new Savimbi strategy has engaged some mainstream U.S. consultant firms as well as some Black persons.

The Southern Africa Support Project lists a number of consultant firms and individuals who receive hefty sums to get support for the Savimbi South Africa UNITA. The organization states that Clarence McKee, a Black attorney, was paid \$171,428.48 from December 1985 to December 1986 to arrange meetings, receptions, interviews and speeches for the President of UNITA. Support Project notes that TRC International of Washington, D.C. was paid \$277,000 from June '86 to December '86 for monitoring legislation concerning UNITA and for contracts with the Administration. Congress and groups for discussions on UNITA's positions.

Southern Africa Support Project reports the Justice Department files as showing that Government Relations International (GRI) is a firm headed by GOP Virginia senatorial candidate Rev. Maurice Dawkins. Dawkins describes himself as the only shareholder. In January, 1987, he signed contracts with Free Angola Information Service (FAIS), which is the name of a foreign principal. The contract shows that Rev. Dawkins was to be paid \$45,000 on a quarterly basis. This money was for generating increased understanding, recognition and support for UNITA in the Black community.

The Support Project says, "Dawkins proved to be particularly effective in his use of the network established by conservative groups and also used his personal connections to raise support for Savimbi." In an interview on NBC's "LIVE IN FIVE," Dawkins

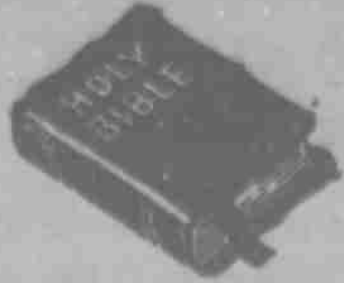

said he opposes South African sanctions. He also stated that he believes in Martin Luther King's position of non-violence. Since Dr. King opposed all forms of violence, including war, it is utterly impossible for Dawkins to believe in his policy of non-violence. Especially, since according to Support Project's report, the Justice Department lists Dawkins as having supported Jonas Savimbi's UNITA devastating, atrocious, inhumane war—probably because he was paid for doing so.

In his U.S. tour, Savimbi will speak at the National Press Club and he will meet with President Reagan.

The major Black organizations and Black leaders who have always been in the forefront for justice and civil rights oppose this country's military support of UNITA, and they consider the Reagan Administration military involvement with UNITA as being in total fusion with South Africa. These organizations plan demonstrations wherever Savimbi appears.
