This year Texas begins the new 5 year license plate.

In 1976, instead of buying a new license plate, motorists will purchase a 1 by 2 inch adhesive-type sticker that will be placed on the upper left corner

In 1977, the sticker will be stuck on the upper right hand following years.

The new 1975 plate features an entirely new design, including the use of vowels for the first time since 1965, when the three-letter system was adopted, only consonents were used.

However, with an ever increasing number of motor vehicles, the entire alphabet will now be employed. As an example, the first 1975 license plate is AAA 10.

The five-year license plate will save Texas taxpayers an estimated \$10.5 million over a four year period, since annual license plate production will no longer be necessary.



Q: As far as feed and feed grains are concerned, what are the differences between concentrates and roughages?

A: Fiber content and the amount of nutrient which is digestible by the animal are the basic criteria for separating these classes.

CONCENTRATES—are feeds generally high in nutrients and low in fiber content. Virtually all grains are in this class, as well as several by-products including linseed meal, cottonseed meal, hominy feed and wheat bran. Many of the concentrates have a high protein content, although this is not a prerequisite of the class.

ROUGHAGES-are high in fiber and low in nutrients. Feeds other than the grains are generally classed as roughage. These include: straw, silage. hay and a variety of coarse byproducts of the plants utilized in feed grain production.
