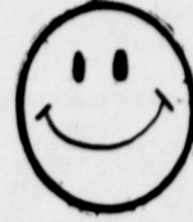

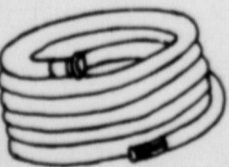

Dedication Services Held At Pleasant Valley

Dedication services were held Sunday at 3:00 p. m. in Pleasant Valley to unveil a historical plaque at the newly improved Pleasant Valley Community Center.

Inscription on the bronze plaque reads: Pleasant Valley Community Center. Established in 1921. A school house for the ranchers' children. First teacher, Miss Virgie Angeley. Land donated by Allison Brothers. Auditorium and modern facilities added in 1956. Used today for all community gatherings, 4-H clubs, boy scouts, Home Demonstration clubs, parties, banquets, weddings, county fairs, etc. Voting Box 6, Lamb County, Texas. Erected by Lamb County Historical Committee.

Future generations can read this plaque and know that the little building on the west, now

a part of the community building, was formerly a one-room school house built in 1921.

The building has been in continuous use longer than any other school building in Lamb County.

Approximately 150 people attended the dedication services. Master of ceremony was Kenneth Duncan of Pleasant Valley.

Rev. Walter Barthoef, pastor of the First Christian Church in Muleshoe gave the invocation. Mrs. Bonnie Haberer then gave a short history of the community.

She introduced special guests Wilma Moore, a former student of the one-room school house; Jube Crawford one of the original trustees and Jewell Stevens Griffith who taught at the school house for four years.

Mrs. Griffith gave a short history on the school and its pro-

gram during the four years she taught.

Special recognition was given to Rosie Moon whose children attended the school.

Mrs. Delores Duncan was introduced and gave a brief history of the Pleasant Valley Community.

District Judge Pat Boone was the guest speaker and gave the dedicatory address.

V. M. Peterman, chairman of the Lamb County Historical Society unveiled the plaque.

If the registration form has been misplaced, the owner will be required to bring his certificate of title and last year's license receipt. This year Texas begins the new 5 year license plate. In 1976, instead of buying a new license plate, motorists will purchase a 1 by 2 inch adhesive-type sticker that will be placed on the upper left corner of the plate. In 1977, the sticker will be stuck on the upper right hand corner, then alternated for the following years. The new 1975 plate features an entirely new design, including the use of vowels for the first time since 1965, when the three-letter system was adopted, only consonants were used. However, with an ever increasing number of motor vehicles, the entire alphabet will now be employed. As an example, the first 1975 license plate is AAA 10. The five-year license plate will save Texas taxpayers an estimated \$10.5 million over a four year period, since annual license plate production will no longer be necessary.

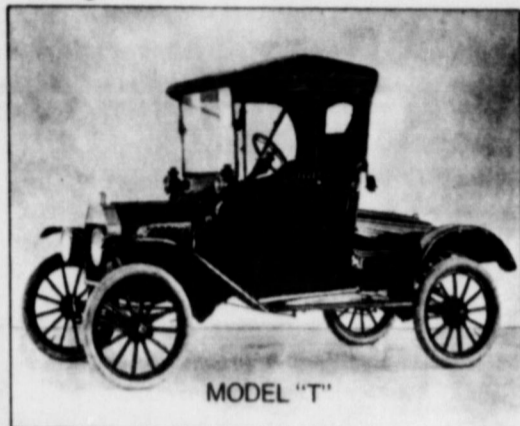

TEXAS TALK

By CALVIN WOOD and EARL JORDAN

Q: As far as feed and feed grains are concerned, what are the differences between concentrates and roughages?

A: Fiber content and the amount of nutrient which is digestible by the animal are the basic criteria for separating these classes.

CONCENTRATES--are feeds generally high in nutrients and low in fiber content. Virtually all grains are in this class, as well as several by-products including linseed meal, cottonseed meal, hominy feed and wheat bran. Many of the concentrates have a high protein content, although this is not a prerequisite of the class.

ROUGHAGES--are high in fiber and low in nutrients. Feeds other than the grains are generally classed as roughage. These include: straw, silage, hay and a variety of coarse by-products of the plants utilized in feed grain production.
