Regan Brown, extension rural sociologist, said four of the communities had participated in the program since its inception 10 years ago. They are Mt. Maxey and Tigertown in Lamar county. Pleasant Hill-Rocky, Blanco e unty and Upland, Caldwell-Hayes counties. Brown said these communities would be presented silver trays.

He listed the 14 communities which have participated in the program for five consecutive years Sunnyside, Castro county; Downard-Fairplains, Cooke county; Cottonwood and Jiba, both of Faufman county; Midway, Red River county: Amity, Comanche county: Harmony, Anderson county; County Line, Houston-Anderson counties; Zimmerscheidt, Colorado county and Axtell and Williw Grove both of McLennan county. The last five named are Negro communities, said Brown. These 14 organized groups will receive special framed certificates of participation.

Brown said the awards were being provided by the Farmer Stockman magazine which sponsors the program in cooperation with the Texas Agracultural extension Service. Presentation of the awards will be made in connection with ceremonies to be held in the neighborhoods when the regular cash awands are presented.

Each of the communities, said Brown, can point with pride to a long list of goals completed in their community improvement work. Each, because of the combined efforts of all neighbors, has become a better place to live, he said Farm and home improvement in these communities can be noted on every hand and Brown cited farm south of Earth. the groups as examples of how cooperation and planned action can be used to rebuild and revitalize communities and rural life.
