





The purpose of the meeting was to discuss the upcoming beef referendum and make plans for a county wide educational program for county producers.

Mahon And Osha

Congressman George Mahon met on Monday in his Washington office with Dr. Eula Bingham, the new Assistant Secretary of Labor for Occupational Safety and Health (OSHA), just prior to his departure for Lubbock where he will testify at the field hearings on the OSHA cotton dust exposure standards. requested the meeting with Bingham to urge the new Secretary to abandon strict cotton dust exposure standards, pointing out that they would paralyze the entire cotton industry.

"I reminded Dr. Bingham that OSHA is the most unpopular agency in the federal government because of some of the foolish and irresponsible actions it has taken in the said Congressman, "and I urged her to abandon the proposed cotton dust standards for cotton gins and cottonseed oil mills."

"I told Dr. Bingham it

would be indefensible for

OSHA to require cotton

conduct field hearings in Lubbock so that the people who would be most affected by the proposed standards would have an opportunity to be heard. Mahon commented

further that he and other members of Congress would not tolerate impossible standards that threaten the viability of the cotton industry.

The Texas Hospital Association (THA) announced its strong op-President "Hospital Cost Carter's Control Act of 1977."

President Carter and HEW Secretary Califano presented the proposed legislation.

The Texas Hospital Association is the trade association for hospitals in Texas with over 690 health care institutions members.

THA, costs. President of headquartered in Austin, said:

The Texas Hospital Association is strongly opposed to the "Hospital Cost Control Act of 1977" as announced by President Carter. This plan would set an arbitrary 9% limit on the amount of increase that a hospital could use to increase the price of it's

services to patients. This convinced that it is not in limit is arrived at by a very complex and complicated formula that will no doubt add a lot of bureaucracy in checking and calculating. The very act itself will increase hospital costs substantially by the amount of paper work that will be involved.

This plan does not permit any sort of control on the cost of supplies or services that a hospital must purchase.

We all acknowledge that health care costs and hospital costa are rising. but there are very definite reasons. The cost of food, energy, telephones and malpractice insurance as well as other supplies has gone up drastically in the past 12 months. Any housewife that has to deal with these, by looking at her own budget, knows that hospital costs un-

doubtedly have to go up to take care of these increased costs. Under this proposal though, these costs are not controlled in any form so the hospital will be forced to absorb the increases. This could financially impair hospitals and cause a drastic reduction in the services that the hospitals be rendering to patients in the areas they

This proposal also has tried to speak to the alleged overbedding in hospitals. Here in Texas, we have a "Certificate of Need" program mandated by the state legislature two years ago, and operated by the Texas Health Facilities Commission, a state agency. Under this system, if a hospital wants to expand the number of beds or it's services, it must apply to the Texas Health Facilities Commission for a "Certificate of Need" and demonstrate that there is a need for the increase in beds or services.

If the Texas Health Facilities Commission finds that there is not sufficient need, then the request is denied.

Hospital and health care costs in Texas are approximately 20% lower than they are nationwide, even though the cost of living is only 10% lower.

This enviable situation in part, brought about by the Statewide Hospital Productivity Center that Texas Hospital Association has been operating for the past 18 months. We have almost 400 to 600 hospitals par-

To date, we can point toover \$20 million that has been saved by Texas patients in this short period of time and these savings are ongoing and will be reoccuring eacy year. The proposed legislation gives no credit to these well managed hospitals, in fact, it penalizes them.
