The Church Of Christ Is Not A Denomination

To what denomination did Peter, Paul, James, John, the three thorsand, Cornelious, the eunuch, Lylia, the Corinthians, and the jailer belong? Were they not just Christians? Did they not belong to the body of Christ, which is the church (Eph. 1:22,23; Col. 1:18)? Yet, they belonged to no denomination. All who were saved became members of this body, the church, which is simply those who have been "called out" of the world into the "kingdom of God's dear Son" (Col. 1:13) by virtue of the fact God added them to it, the church - Acts 2:47. Yet they belonged to no denomination.

If a sinner believes in Christ with all his heart, repents and turns from nis sins, confesses Christ, and is baptized, not into some denominations, but into Christ (Rom, 6:3, 4; Gal. 3:27,) just as were the 3000 in Acts the second chapter, the eunuch, Lydia, Cornelius, the jailer etc., will that make him a member of any denomination on Earth? If so, to which one did Peter and Paul, Lydia and the jailer, Cornelius and eunuch belong? If a sreat nember should do just what these of the New Testament did. would it not make them a great number of Christians? Should this number come together on the first day of the week for worship (Acts 20:7,) call themselves by the same name as did the Apostles and early Christians, accept and teach the Bible as their only rule of faith and practice, will that make them a denomination? If so, which one?
