Hail Suppression Planes To Fly

Hail Suppression planes have been granted permission to fly and operate again in this area, after the Water Development Board members in Austin Thursday took the easy way out of making a controversial decision on the bitterly-opposed license renewal applications for two South Plains weather modification companies. one of which is based here in Littlefield.

According to Attorney Jerome Kirby of Littlefield. who represented the companies at hearings in Austin, he expects Governor Briscoe to sign legislation next week allowing citizens in the area to vote on their preferences of whether they want weather modification or not

At the urging of Lubbock board member George McCleskey, the six-man panel unanimously approved a motion by Glen Roney of McAllen to grant permits to the companies, a concession to them, but only through October 31 and only for the target area and operational areas
