



## Farm Facts

About 51% of the 1959cotton crop was harvested mechanically. An estimated 36% was machine picked and 15% was machine stripped. From the Carolinas to central Texas and in irrigated areas of the Far West, when cotton is harvested by hand workers pick the fleece

from the open bolls.

The spindle-type picker duplicates this process as its revolving spindles en-gage and pull the cotton from the bolls. It does not pull leaves or unopened bolls. Picking, therefore, may be repeated as often as

necessary.
In cotton yielding 300 pounds of lint per acre, the average hand picker gathers about 20 pounds of seed cot-ton per hour. The one-row mechanical picker can pick almost 650 pounds per hour. It can do the work of from 30 to 40 hand pickers.


