



What's Happening To Agriculture?

Many people today are puzzling over the "Programming" of farming by the government They wonder why we have controls and quotas and price supports. More clearly, they want to know why the farmer can't just "take his chances" in growing and sell ing with no holds barred.

They wonder, without realizing that the well being argicul ture is an absolute essential to the economic health of our nat ion, just how the farmer became such a governmental concern.

Quite a few years ago, when the entire national economy was on wobbly legs, first efforts for restoration were aimed at agricu lture, Farm programs and adjust ments and allotments were set to work

Since that time when the age old barometer for farm successsupply and demand became top heavy, new programs and new words began showing up on the agriculture front. Controls were born of necessity; allotments, re strictions and subsidies became their expression.
