WATER CONSERVATION AND IMPORTATION:
Water is the life-blood of our irngated economy, and hes planning cannot be over-emphasized. Feasibility studies for importing water to the high-plains from the lower Mississippi basin should be pushed forward at maximum speed. Funding on these-and impor-
tation itself-must come from congress, with maximum state-federal our district is far behind on planning for flood control and conservation dams on our creeks. We
