Any farmer in Lamb County whose cotton acreage is in excess of his farm's allotment is reminded that he must dispose of the excess acreage within 20 days after the date of the County Com mittees notice of such exces cotton acreage.

According to Troy Armes, chairman of the county agricultural stabilization and conservation committee it is very important that cotton farmers pay close attention to this Notice. If it was not possible to dispose of the excess cotton acreage within the time limit because of circumstances beyond the farmer's control, it is suggested that he immediate get in touch with the County ASC office. The cost of recheck ing any acreage disposed of must be paid by the producer
