### Perrenial Sweet Sudan Developed

Payment Being Issued in August College Station - A synthetic, tetraploid of the sorghum species has been developed by the Texas Agricultural Experiment Station afworkers all over the nation have Hutton said, will get benefit pay ter 15 years of breeding and se-

This tetraploid, pehhlennial sweet Sudangrass, was obtained by doubling the chromosomes of Common Sudangrass by treatment with colchicine and crossing it with Johnsongrass. It has good forage qualities with sweet and juicy stalks, good fertility and seed production qualities, and a good perennial root growth habit intermediate between Johnsongrass and Sudangrass Its roots do not penetrate as deeply as those of Johnsongrass, so it is unlikely to become a pest.

A leaflet just released by the Experiment Station, "Perennal Sudangrass", gives pertinent information on this new grass. Included in the leaflet are sections on growth habits, palatabilty and pro ductivity, forage qualities, seeding habits, its capabilities as a cover crop and sources of seed. Seed should be available for planting from commerical seed companies in the summer of 1958.


