These samples will be sent to the laboratory at College Station and stud-

ed there. Samples from the Coastal Plains ection are being taken at Robstown. The samples from Eastern Texas at Henderson; for the Central Texas Blackland section at Hillsboro; for the Brazos Valley area at Bryan; and the samples taken at Lubbock are to be representative of the Northwest Texas area.

The actual samples will be gathered over a period of three months and Mr. Spilman will remain for the period to select representative samples suitable for the purpose of the study

It is expected that the farmers and cotten buyers will cooperate n securing these samples since the data are absolutely necessary to the study, which, if effective, should simplify the problem of ascertaining the correct values of the various staples and grades of Texas cottons and if these cottons are correctly evaluated, there is a general impression that farmers having the better grades and staples will be able to secure more nearly their proper worth in the market.

Having accomplished this much, Mr. Crawford thinks the tendency will become more toward improv ed staples and grades which have seen a gradual decline for the past twenty years.




