10.) - American soldiers were under fire opposite Mulata today. The federals under General Luque made a determined assault on the town, but were repulsed with heavy losses. An-

During the battle the Mexican soldiers used two field guns. Four shells burst on the American side of the river near Troop H, of the Third cavalry, which patrolled the river. The American troops were under fire for five hours. A Mexican boy was shot in the leg while standing beside Captain Williams.

The battle was a spectacular Mulata stands on the bank of the Rio Grande and the bullets and shells swept across the river. Several times the Mexican soldiers deliberately fired volleys at women and children refugees on the American side.

After shelling the town at long range the soldiers advanced and the insurgents opened fire. The hottest fight took place along the ditch. Twice the federals captured the ditch, but each time were driven out by the rebels. In the last charge the insurrectos were led by a Scotchman, F. S. McCombs, and an American. Seven Mauser rifles were captured in this charge.

The federals numbered 325, according to their own announcement. The pronunciades had 200 men in Mulata. The Mexi All of Leaders and Most of Legislators can soldiers were commanded by Gen. 





POWER IS WITH COUNTY JUDGE

n That Office Alone Rests Jurisdiction In Saloon Cases.

San Antonio, Feb. 10.-All power to grant or revoke liquor licenses lodges in the hands of the county judge, and there is no remedy by appeal from his decision, according to an opinion handed down by the Fourth Court of Civil Appeals which, for the first time in Texas, construes the Robertson Fitzhugh liquor law and thus etablishes a prece dent for the State of Texas. 
