## To Be Held May 29th, 1909 $\ldots$ Of Vital Interest

In order that the voters of the independent school district of
Memphis may thoroughly understand the matters to be decided Memphis may thoroughly understand the matters to be decided
by the election which has been ordered by the School Board to be held May 29, 1903, the law goveraing the taxing power of
corporated districts for sohool purposes ouly," is here given:

Seen or may hereatter be iacorporated under general or specie laws for school purposes only, shall have power to levy and collec an annual ad valorem tax not to exceed 50 cents on the $\$ 100$ val uation of taxable property of the distrlet for the maintenance
schools therein and a tax not to exceed 23 cents on the $\$ 100$ for tu purchase of sites and purchasing, constracting, repairing or equip ping public free school baildings within the limits of sush in
corporated districts, provided that the amount of maintenance tax ogether with the amount of bond tax of the district shall neve exceed 50 cents on the $\$ 100$ valuation of taxable property. Said
trustees shall have power to issue coupon bonds of the district for building purposes to be made payable not exceeding forty years from date, in such sums as they shall deem expedient, to bear in terest not to exceed 5 per cent per annum; provided, that whe
buildings are to be wooden the bonds herein provided for shall not bulldings are to be wooden the bonds herein provided for shall not
