## PRESS FREEDOM ESSENTIAL

GENERAL Hugh S. Johnson, head of NRA, who for a long time fought the desire of newspapers to has finally come around to the point of the newspaphas themselves, and states that he is stronger now for "freedom of the press" than even before
At first, Johnson could not see why newspapers hould be given certain privileges or in what way the press differed from any other concerns. Undoubte y, if the newspapers in Germany were uncensored allowed to say what they think and give the news ac man people would not be crushed by the man today. Correct information, given quickly and concisely, will, in many cases, give the peoply opportunity to
form their opinions and put down any uprising of power that might crush them if it were allowed to get a strong hold before it was discovered. A govern ment-controled press might mean the end of American liberty.
