





Washington, June 16 .-- Repre centatives Black and Jones of Texas Saturday succeeded in having the House adopt amendments to the Nayal Appropriations Bill of great importance to the enlisted personnel of the Navy. Black's amendment authorizes the Secretary of the Navy to pay discharg-

ed sailors five cents a mile to his home from the place where he is demobilized just as is provided for discharged soldiers.
