## ONE DEAD, OTHERS SERIOUSLY

 INJURED, IN SUNDAY'S STORMEtheridge Lewellen Loses Life, Little Lloyd Smith has Skull Crushed when Houses on Browder Ranch are De molished by Hail Storm, Others Injured
COVERS WIDE SECTION, DESTRUCTION GREAT
Many Houses are Blown Down and Crops Over Wide Area are Utterly Destroyed, Loss will Reach Several Hundred Thousand

Dollars in This Vicinity
The terriffic rain and hail storm, or storms, which covered this section last Sunday night, took a heavy toll. Etheridge Lewellen, a young man of 25 , was killed at the Browder ranch and little Lloyd Smith, son of Mr. and Mrs. Dan Smith, at the old Pot-Hooks headquaters, two miles from the Browder place, had his skull crushed and broken, perhaps fatal injuries. The houses on both places were completely wrecked and blown to pieces. The home of J. A. Scott, in the western part of Memphis, was blown down; both Mr. and Mrs. Scott being in the building at the time. Mr. Scott received a severe but not serious injury to his left eye and Mrs. Scott was hurt but little. That these two people, who are quite aged, escaped without serious injury seems remarkable. Numerous buildings in Memphis, including one brick business house were seriously damaged and numerous houses, barns and out buildings over a territory thirty miles wide were blown away or wrecked. Aside from these damages the loss of crops from the hail will reach hundreds of thousands in this immediate vicinity. A eonsiderable part of this latter loss was wholly or partially cov èred by insurance; claims for over $\$ 150,000$ in crop losses have been filled here. A larger per cent of farmers are said to have crop insurance this year than ever before. F. S. Conn, who lived six miles west of Wellington, was killed by the storm Sunday night and his wife and son are reported to be badly, perhaps fatally injured. All telephone and telegraph connection to the east, west and north was severed by the storm. In point of damage and area covered this was, undoubtly, the worst storm in the history of this section.
