Special to The Democrat HEDLEY, July 30-Twenty eight Donley County 4-H Club boys are attending the 26th annual farmers short course at College Station.



We believe idle park sites should now be beautified and made to serve the people, as they were originally intended by those who founded them. We should not feel that beautiful parks should be restricted to the so-called


exclusive sections of this ALLEY OPP




