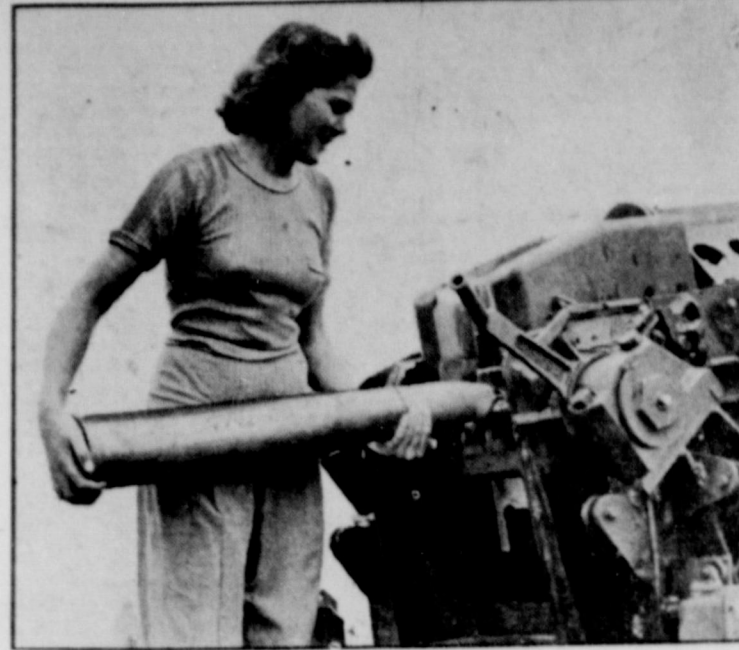

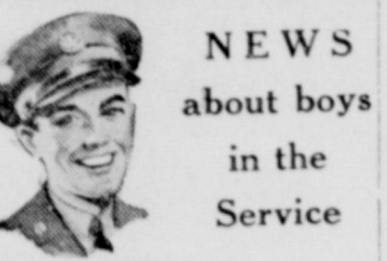

SUNDAY SCHOOL LESSON

Encourage Frank, Open Discussion Of Temperance

The International Uniform Sunday School Lesson for June 28.
Text: Proverbs 21:17; 23:32; Isaiah 5:20-23; Hosea 4:11; Joel 3-2, 3; Ephesians 5:18.

It is obvious that alcohol is the occasion of an immense amount of propagandism. For many years those who favor total abstinence and who have been opposed to the liquor traffic have carried on extensive and highly organized propagandism.

Propagandism in itself is neither good nor bad. Education, the preaching of the gospel, movements for better social conditions, advertising, and publicity are all forms of propagandism.

The question which is the better practice must be settled on wider grounds than individual habit or experience. The Bible as a whole undoubtedly commends total abstinence, though some passages are and have been of disputed bearing.
