THE Texas Federation of Women's Clubs has taken a stand against the proposed amendment to the state constitution, to be voted on November 6, fixing the maximum amount of taxes which can be collected and expended, through its president, Mrs. Vol-
ney Taylor, who recently addressed club women of ney Taylo
This stand added much strength to the opposition, already led by the state's school officials.
ground that it is a tax-shifting amendment rather than a tax-reducing measure, and insisted that its effect would be to reduce state taxes paid by large small taxpaye
Mrs. Taylor's statement also said that "the adop-
ion of this amendment would inevitably mean the tion of this amendment would inevitably mean the reduction or elimination of state aid to the rural and other public schools, making necessary the transfe of this load to the local communities."
"Any increase in local taxation, such as would be
brought about by the adoption of this amendment," Mrs. Taylor continued, "would tend.. to withdraw the benefits of the homestead exemption from the small home-owner." In this, Mrs. Taylor refers to the exemption to state taxation to the extent of a valua
