Sudden Death in a Silo
A recent fatal accident in Ohio
calls attention to a danger to
farmers which cannot be to
widely circulated. Since 1875,
when the first Americansilo was
built by Dr. Maniey Miles, this
method of preserving forage for
livestokk has been generally

ment of Agriculture has tre
quently called attention to the
danger of carbon dioxid gas ace
cumulating in silos under certain
conditions, no fataliteses have
been reported heretofore. On
the Athens (Ohio) State Hospital,
