# INSURANCE COMMISSIONER BRINGS SAFETY WARNING

## Warns of Danger from Fires during Christmas Holidays

Hall, Fire Insurance Commissioner of Texas, this week expressed great concern that more than 4,000 men, women and children were burned to death by fire during the months of October and November. He called upon the public generally to help reduce the fire losses, particularly during the holiday season, by practicing fire prevention.

Mr. Hall stated, has taken a staggering death toll of approximately 4,000 in Texas during the past ten years, an average annually of four hundred people burned to death.

One of the most puzzling facts about deaths from fire, Hall added, is that during the past five

years when the annual property loss by fire in Texas has been the lowest in the history of the state, the annual death loss by fire has been the highest, which is indicative of the fact that too many people have not yet learned to fear fire and to observe the most simple rules of fire prevention.

Illustrating the fact that the people in many instances do not fear fire and fail to observe the rules of fire prevention, Mr. Hall pointed to the fact that more than ten men, women and children were burned to death during October and November by getting too close to unprotected gas heaters, wood stoves and fireplaces, resulting in their clothes becoming ignited, and that all ten of these deaths could have been prevented had these room heaters been equipped with standard screen guards.

Other simple rules of fire prevention to prevent death by fire outlined by Mr. Hall are as follows:

Teach children the danger of playing with matches.

Never use gasoline or kerosene to start or quicken a fire.

Matches and cigarettes are breeders of fire. Always extinguish before discarding.

Keep gas heaters and stoves a safe distance from windows.

Gasoline is not a household commodity and does not belong in the home.

Electricity is dangerous. Do not experiment with it. Call an electrician.

When gas is used for heating purposes always ventilate with fresh air.

Use every precaution with gas heaters and rubber hose connections, and be sure that both are safe and in good repair.

All cleaning when done at home should be done out of doors.

Do not leave small children in the house alone for even a minute.

Use safe lighting appliances and non-inflammable articles and materials on the Christmas tree.

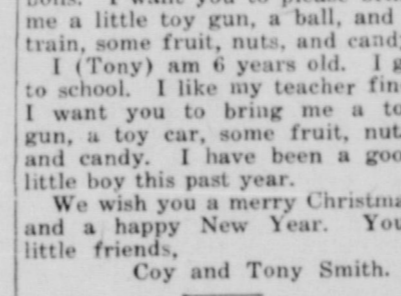

SOUTH CALIFORNIA to beat Duke in the Rose Bowl at Pasadena—  
Texas Christian to defeat Carnegie Tech in the Sugar Bowl at New Orleans—  
Tennessee to down Oklahoma in the Orange Bowl in Miami—  
And St. Marys to beat Texas Tech in the Cotton Bowl at Dallas.  
Thus do we go out on a limb for the last time this season as the above clubs make ready to wage war in the four major bowl games on New Year's Day.  
Southern California proved by its decisive rout of a great Notre Dame club, that the power the Trojans were supposed to possess was more than just hearsay.  
Howard Jones' best team since 1932 this year defeated Oregon State, Ohio State, Washington State, Stanford, Oregon, California and U. C. L. A. The Trojans lost to Alabama in the season's opener, and Washington in an upset.  
DUKE not only is undefeated and untied, but hasn't had a single point scored against it this year.  
Close examination of the Blue Devils' schedule doesn't indicate a terrific strain, however. Wallace Wade's boys beat V. P. L. Davidson, Colgate, Georgia Tech,

Wake Forest, North Carolina, Syracuse, North Carolina State and Pitt. Only Pitt and North Carolina may be classed as top-ranking teams.  
The Blue Devil line, led by Captain Dan Hill, a great center, did a swell job of stopping Pitt's vaunted attack—which was minus the services of the Marshall Goldberg most of the second half. But halting the Trojan warhorse led by Granny Lansdell, Bob Hoffman, Mickey Anderson, and a host of others, seems a little too difficult.  
UNDEFEATED Texas Christian, led by little Davey O'Brien, the outstanding football player of 1938, looms too strong for Carnegie Tech, which lost only to Notre Dame this year. The Horned Frogs ought to have things just as they please in New Orleans.  
The closest bowl game of all should be the Tennessee-Oklahoma battle in Miami. The Sooners from the southwest are more rugged, but the Vol offense sparked by George Cafego is a little too brilliant.  
And in the Cotton Bowl at Dallas, Texas Tech, undefeated in 10 straight games, appears doomed to fall before its 11th foe—a St. Marys team which is one of the finest on the west coast.
