Paper Shell Pecans in Three Years.

Editor Home and Farm:

Any farmer in the cottongrowing belt of this country, if he has a pecan or hickory stump with growing sprouts around it. has a foundation for a paper shell tree near at hand. Any time during the coming winter two of these sprouts around one stump can be grafted-whip or cleft graft—and if they fail to grow then two more sprouts around the stump can be chip budded in March, April or May, and if these fail then two more sprouts of next year's growth can be set with ring buds from June 1 to October 1.

So for about eight months of the year, with anything like good growing season for farm crops, this budding and grafting can be going on. With the long season we have for the work, and millions of pecan and hickory stumps and millions more of young pecan and hickory trees standing on branches, creeks rivers of the South (millions of acres of waste producing no revenue), what a great opportunity there is for our Southland to add to our annual income.

Five years after a budded or grafted tree begins to bear, its annual yield should be from \$5 to \$10 and increase on up, so that in twenty to twenty-five years our Southland pecan crop would yield a great revenue.

Let our farmers and land owners once get awake to the possibilities of the great revenue producer on our waste lands, and our school children, boys and girls, taught to graft and bud, and millions of trees will be worked each year, until all the acres of waste land will equal in revenue our best farm lands. One hundred thousand boys and girls of our Southland ought to be encouraged to plant pecan nuts for shade trees and then teach them how to bud and graft. Agitate-educate-is the plan to be adopted and results will be sure to follow
