That the long-horned, or Spansh breed of cattle, once so numerous in the Southwest, may be pre- kill any cripples or droopy lookserved from complete extinction, the Forest Service, United States the Forest Service, United States Department of Agriculture, will maintain a herd on the Wichita National Forest in Oklahorm ac. National Forest in Oklahoma, according to an announcement made to-day by Col. W. B. Greeley, chief forester.

The department has for several years urged the necessity for a small herd of these picturesque ands of sufferers that it is a deexamples of early pioneer life of the Southwest for the benefit and education of future generations interested in pioneer history, said Colonel Greeley. The Wichita national forest lies right in the heart of the range of the old southern herds of plains buffalo. and is part of the region formerly known as the Indian Territory, where now live more than fifty thousand Indians. Here also grazed some of the pioneer herds these long-horned cattle when the livestock industry in the Southwest was in its infancy.

There are still a few living members of this once numerous breed of cattle to be found in Texas. The herd for the Government will be selected by expert cattlemen familiar with the characteristics of the cattle and of the southwestern ranges. They will be grazed in a pasture immediately adjoining the one occupied by the herd of buffalo now established on the forest.


