For I will take the burrs out before they reach the stands.

There are some of you who have to be shown. That's just what I want to do-show you. I have about 60 bales of hard, dirty bollies in the cotton house that $I$ am going to gin out on the 20th and 21 st of this month, so come down and let me prove to you that I can make the best sample out of bollies. And don't forget to look at the clean burr pile.
