A business man of Arkansas recently received a letter from the Federal Barge Lines, in a franked envelope, soliciting his ousiness. He replied-and gist of what he had to say was that he would never ship anything over that subsidized line, and that he resented the free use of the mails for sales promotion efforts. His views are shared by a legion of American citizens. The difference is that most of them do nothing about it. 
