COLLEGE STAT 18.—With nearly 14,000 ers signing Governmen contracts the campaign wheat acreage reduction in as has exceeded a 90 per c sign-up of the State's acreagit is estimated by Texas A and M Extension Service officials. More than \$5,300,000 is expected to come to Texas this winter and early next summer in benefit payments, of which more than three and one-half millions are due this winter.

Review boards in Amarillo and Fort Worth have concluded their work of approving applications and contracts county by county, and most of the contracts are now being reviewed by the national board in Washington, or are on their way.

More than 90 per cent of the wheat allotted to 28 heavy producing counties in the Panhandle was estimated taken up in contracts, and those counties are expected to receive a total of more than four and one-nalf million dollars in winter and summer payments. Of the total Texas allotment, 85 per cent was given those 28 counties because they produced 85 per cent of the Texas crop for the period

In 46 wheat counties in the rest of the State it is estimated that more than 50 per cent of the total allotments have been taken up, indicating that about one half million dollars will be paid in benefits this winter and next summer.


