More than 1000 families were left homeless and approximately 5,600 relief cases will be re-oping floods the swept devastan during the past two weeks. Tab ulation of reports from ministrators in 51 counties sho that 6,130 additional families are in need of assistance as a result of the high water.
The survey showed 150 homes of relief clients destroyed and 53 homes damaged.
Some 300 houses of non-relief clients were destroyed and 1,500 houses
The bulk of the loss appeared to be in the counties along the Colorado river. Principal suffer-
ers among the counties already ets among the counties already reported are Travis, with 140 homeless and more than 600 homes destroyed or damaged, Bastrop, with 500 homes dam aged, and a check-up yet to come
from Wharton and Matagorda from W
In Northeast Texas, Fannin county reported 300 homes dam aged, and Bowie county reported
250 families temporarily homeless.
In the Hill Country, Kimble county reported 30 homes de stroyed, 35 damaged, and $3: 1$ families homeless.
4. West of San Antonio, Medina county reported 25 homes destroyed, 275 damaged, and 45 families homeless.
Extent of the damage in Brazoria, Matagorda, McMullen and Cameron counties was yet to be determined. In the latter county a project had been rushed thru to permit 200 relief workers to aid in the reinforcement of strained levees.

ffected counties to be used in eeting the emergency. Adam R. Johnson, state relief director, said relief funds will be used in aiding certified relief cases. Eludgetary labor may also be used to rebuild and repair houses accupied by relief clients, provided the landlord will acknowledge eceipt of such labor in lieu of rent for a proper period of time.
