modernization credit ad̃vanced in amounts up to $\$ 50,000$ for the purpose of modernization or the machinery in industrial, commercial, and commercial-residentia
buildings. Details have been simplified to a great extent. The procedure suggested to the in-
dividual by the Housing Administration is as follows
Decide what is
modernizing building and equip
Consult equipment manufacturers and dealers and building contractor as to the cost of the
modernization work planned. modernization work planned.
Go to a bank or other local financial institution that display the "house in the circle" sign,
which means it has qualified fo Federal Housing Administration credit insurance.
Make application to the lending institution for credit in the usual way.
The carrying charges on credi insured by the Federal Housing Administration are at the lowest
rates. The maximum must not rates. The maximum must not exceed the equivalent of a $\$ 5$ discount per $\$ 100$ face amount of monthly installments monthly installments.
