erstood in terms of physical understood in terms of physical pleasure alone，but also as

regulations would be regulations would be
meaningless and chaos would ensue．There must be some guiding principle behind our activities and Utility is one of our sources． Even though we use

best for all？What if I disagree？ What if a large minority disagree？Are the desires and pleasures of a majority always the guides to what is right？does not history teach us that a

many areas of life．The many areas of life．The
principles of Utilitarianism may be helpful in certain cases，but the cost may be higher than we want to pay if this is going to be our sole ethical guide in life．If you do not think so，just gauge your response the next time the president asks you to pay for
