Dr. Gene W. Rogers

Dr. Gene Warren Rogers, 72, died on Tuesday, January 4,1994. Services were held on Saturday, January 8, 1994 at 1:00 p.m. at St. John's Episcopal Church in Sonora with the Rev. Monte Jones officiating.

Dr. Rogers was born on April 26, 1921 in Cleves, Ohio. He had practiced medicine in Sonora since November of 1991. He was loved and respected by his many patients and friends.

Dr. Rogers was a veteran of the Armed Forces of the united States and served honorably in the U.S. Navy.

He received his medical training at the University of Cincinnati, interned at St. Luke's Hospital in Denver, Colorado, and completed his surgical residency in Los California Angeles, Methodist Hospital of Dallas, Texas.

Dr. Rogers has served in the community and service oriented organizations including the Downtown Lions Club. He was Chief of Staff at Hudspeth Memorial Hospital. He is the past president of the Oak Cliff Country Club, the Private Clinics Hospital Association of Texas, the Federation of American Hospitals, the Board of Trustees of Midway Park Hospital, and the North Texas Clinic Association.

At the time of his death he was the president of the Society of Insurance Medical Directors of Texas, having been elected to this post by reason of his position of Medical Director of the Bankers Commercial Life Provident American Insurance companies of Dallas.






